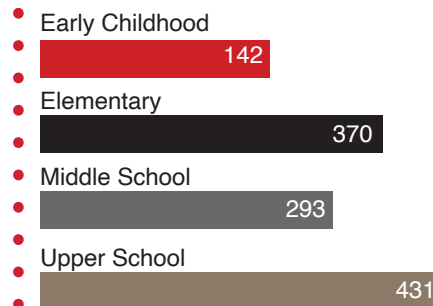
2023 - 2024 SCHOOL PROFILE

The School

- An International Baccalaureate (IB) World School, Carrollwood Day School (CDS) was founded in 1982 and currently serves students from age two through 12th grade. In May 2009, the school graduated its first senior class. CDS is recognized nationally for its academic excellence and its innovative school-wide emphasis on character development. The curriculum for Carrollwood Day School follows guidelines established by the IB organization. CDS is one of only 36 schools in the United States authorized to offer the full curriculum / continuum of IB programmes from early childhood through college preparatory. In 2020, CDS was inducted into the Cum Laude Society, the highest academic honor society a secondary school can earn in the U.S. In 2021, construction was completed on the new Center for Innovation, bringing an additional 40,600 square feet to accommodate a new student union, entrepreneurial center dedicated to innovation, new science wing with state-of-the-art labs, as well as design technology and visual arts classrooms. As part of the addition, the Dr. Shalin and Neha Patel College Counseling Center opened in 2021, a dynamic space for student support. In 2022, CDS was selected as a Round Square member, an international network of 250 schools committed to international exchange and experiential learning. The school emphasizes performance, collaboration, and moral character, believing in the importance of building an ethical learning community to define its students as the future leaders of a global society.

Clubs represent a wide range of interests including these: American Sign Language, AV League, Beta Club, CDS Ambassadors, CDS Vex Robotics Club, Chemistry Club, Club La Conexión, Dance Committee, Future Business Leaders, Genders and Sexualities Alliance, History Club, HOSA - Future Health Professionals, Key Club, Model Diplomacy, Model UN, Speech & Debate, STEM Society, Thespians, Yearbook Club. The 2020-2021 Breaking Ground Clubs include: Archery, Art Appreciation, Bible Study, Do Something Club, Dungeons & Dragons, Euphoria, FSEA, Grill Club, Guiding Little Patriots, Jewish Forum, Meditation, Movie Film Club, Newspaper, Ping Pong Club, and Red Reign.

International Baccalaureate Programme

Carrollwood Day School is honored to partner with the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). Carrollwood Day School is the only school on the west coast of Florida to offer the full five-year Middle Years Programme (MYP) curriculum. CDS has been an IB World School since 2005 and was the sixth school in the United States fully authorized to offer the continuum of Primary Years Programme (PYP) - Middle Years Programme (MYP) - Diploma Programme (DP) curricula and the first IB World School in Florida to achieve this distinction. IB at CDS begins with the PYP in the Lower School with students in preschool through grade 5. The PYP emphasizes the interrelatedness of knowledge and skills through a transdisciplinary program of inquiry providing a strong foundation for the rigor of the MYP and DP programmes in grades 6 through 12.

Middle Years Programme (MYP): Grades 6 - 10

The MYP helps students develop learning attitudes and skills that will enable them to participate actively and responsibly in society. Learning how to evaluate information critically is as important as learning facts. The students' experiences with the MYP culminates in their sophomore year with a yearlong personal project where students choose and explore a topic of their choice that showcases their unique interests and talents.

Diploma Programme (DP): Grades 11 - 12

The IB Diploma Programme is a rigorous pre-university course of studies that meets the needs of highly motivated secondary school students. Unlike most IB schools, at CDS the IB Diploma Programme is designed to be inclusive so a student can register as a full IB Diploma Candidate, an IB Course Candidate, or a CDS graduate based on his or her individual needs for academic rigor. Approximately 70% graduate as full IB students and 100% of students in 11th and 12th grade enroll in at least one IB course.

Requirements of the IB Curriculum

9th and 10th Grades (Middle Years Programme):

- Maximum of eight courses (up to six core) per semester
- At least 25 hours of community service per year
- Completion of the Personal Project consisting of a process journal, a final product and a personal statement
- The study of at least two languages (language of instruction and additional language of choice).

11th and 12th Grades (Diploma Programme):

- Maximum of six core courses per semester
- **Extended Essay (EE):** 4,000-word research essay on a topic of special interest
- **Theory of Knowledge (TOK):** 1-credit critical thinking/ inquiry based course with a required exhibition and 1,600-word essay
- **Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS):** 18 months of continuous hours in artistic pursuits, athletics, and/or community service work for appreciation of life outside the classroom
