A sound source is something that makes sound. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Can you change the volume to make it louder or softer?</li> <li>○ Do you feel a vibration from the sound source? Vibrations are caused by sound waves moving back and forth quickly. Vibrations make the object shake.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Based on an Indian folktale



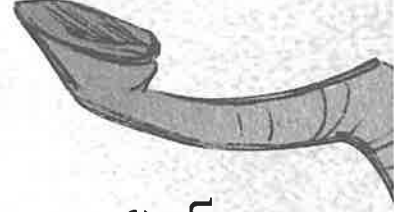
