	<p>EL (Language Development) Anyone can do these activities in any language:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Syllables are word parts. Each syllable usually has one vowel sound. <i>Classroom</i> has two syllables. (Class*room). <i>Home</i> has one syllable. <i>Animal</i> has three syllables (An*i*mal). ● Write the names of your family members. These are words. Then, clap out the syllables for each name. Write down the number of syllables behind each name.
	<p>Math: <i>Priority Benchmark: 3.1.2.3 Represent multiplication facts by using a variety of approaches, such as repeated addition, equal-sized groups, arrays, area models, equal jumps on a number line and skip counting.</i> <u>Fluency:</u> Skip-Count by 2's and 5's to 100. 	<p>STEM:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Vibrations while talking - Put your fingers on your vocal cord. Your vocal cords are found in your neck under your chin. ● Talk, sing, or make noises while touching your vocal cords. What do you feel? ● Try talking, singing, or making noises in a high voice, low voice, or any other different voices. Does this change what you feel?
	<p>Physical Education:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Jump, Jump Jump side-to-side over an object or line for 1 minute straight. Go again but jump front to back. Repeat each jump twice.

Listen to a song and tell someone or write down 3 things you noticed.

- Smile in the mirror for 10 seconds: Smiling slows the heart and relaxes the body.

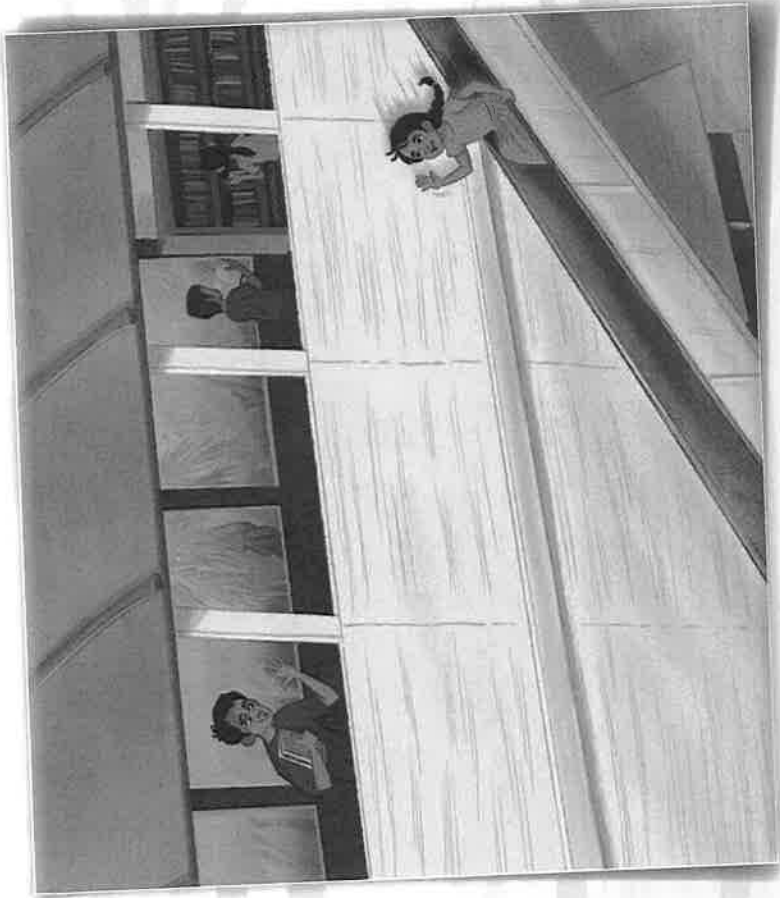


My School Floats!

My name is Tripty, and I live in Bangladesh. It often floods in the area where I live. Then the only way out is by boat. In fact, my school is a boat. It floats!

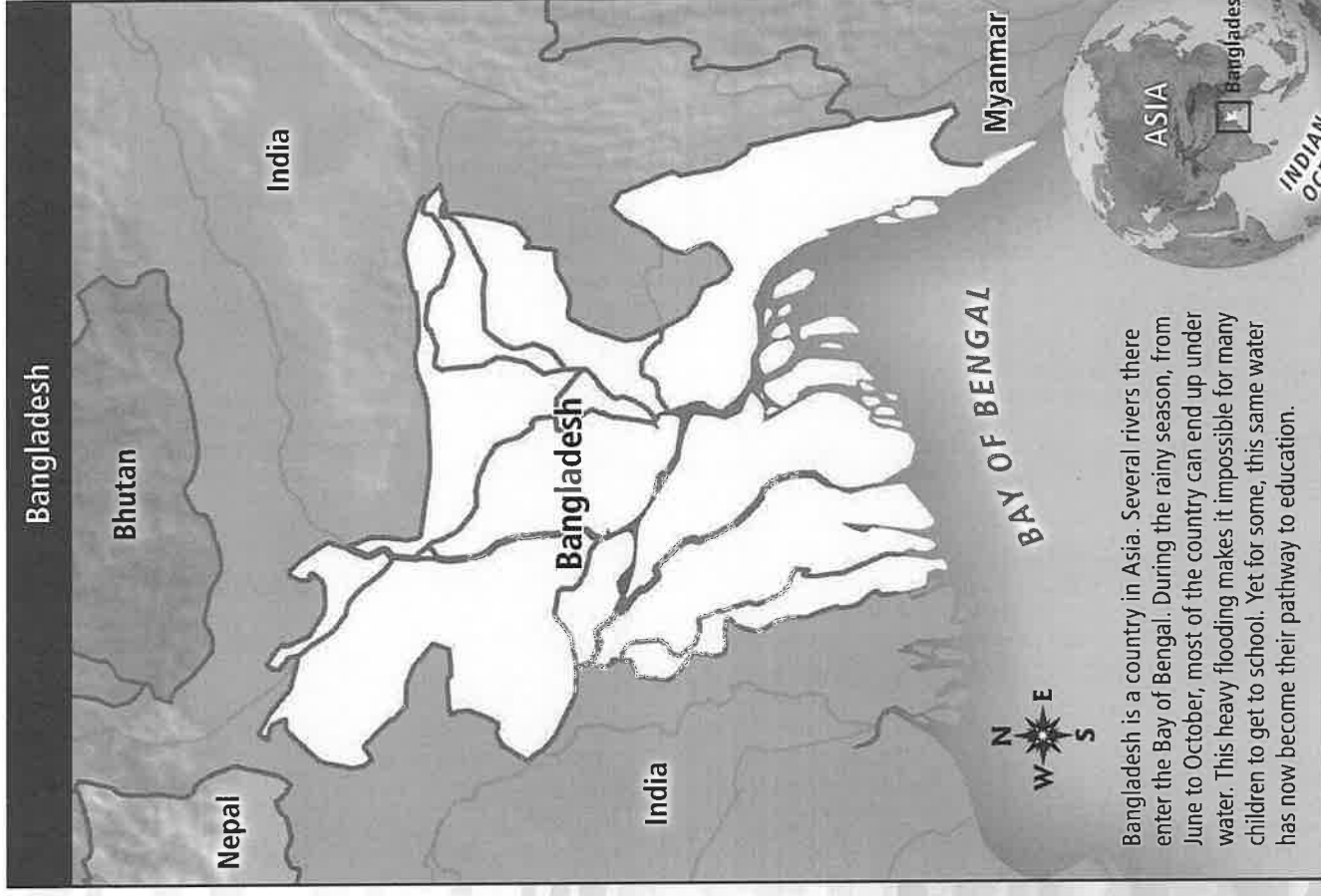
