The Elves and the Shoemaker

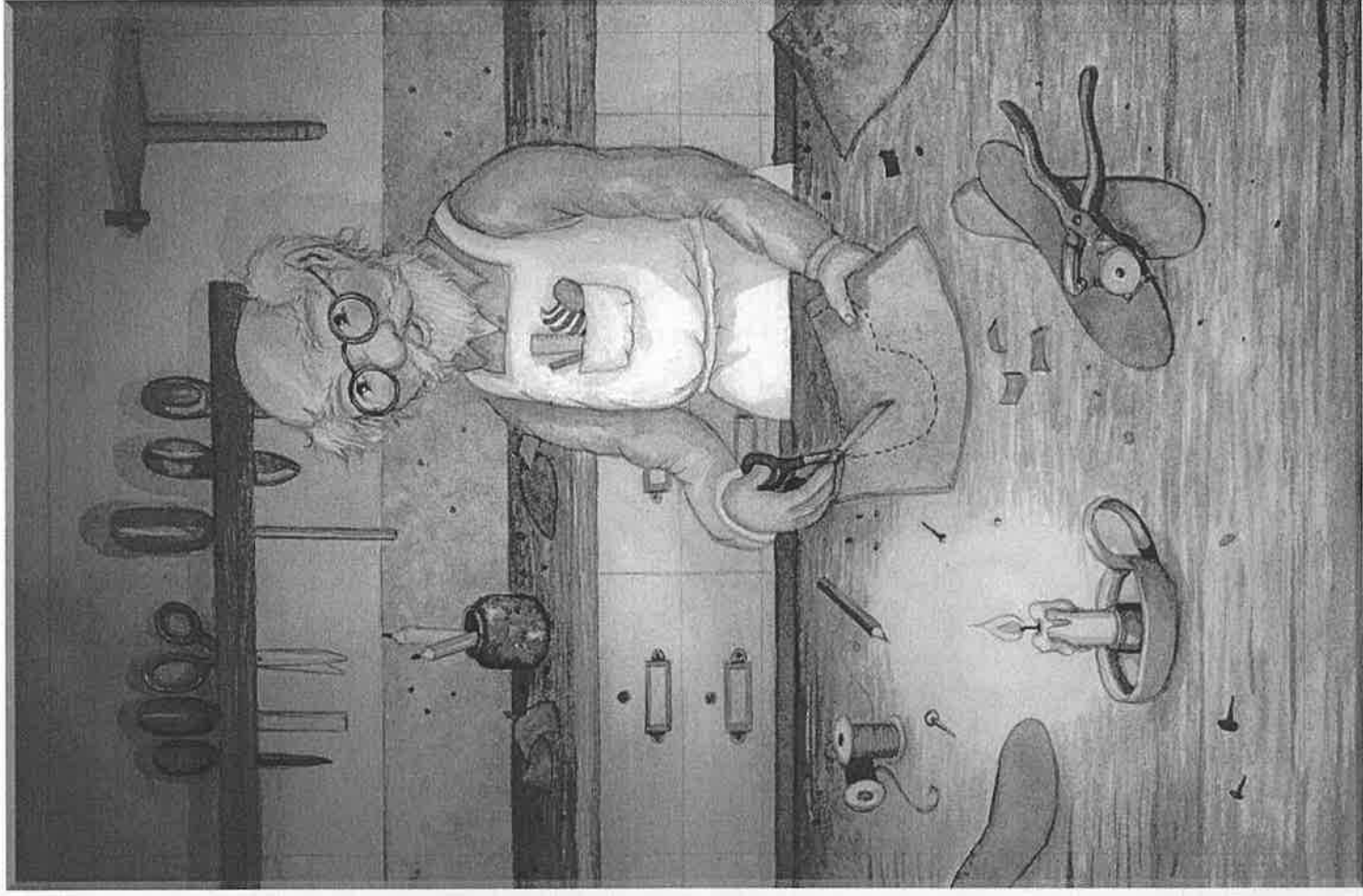
