**COMPLAINT PROCEDURE FOR DISCRIMINATION**

Any student or staff member who feels he or she has been a victim of discrimination because of race, religion, national origin, disability, sexual orientation or gender bias, should make a report to the Complaint Officer, Director of Pupil Personnel Services, 781-767-1226, or the Building Principal. Civil Rights Complaint Forms are available in all school principal's offices and in the central office.

**ALTERNATIVE COMPLAINT PROCEDURES**

In addition to, or instead of, filing a discrimination complaint through this policy, a person may choose to exercise other options, including but not limited to filing a complaint with outside agencies or filing a private lawsuit.

**COMPLAINT PROCEDURE FOR DISCRIMINATION**

The MCAD investigates complaints about discrimination in any public-school program or course of study. Filing must occur within 6 months of the alleged discriminatory educational practice or harassment incident.
