


Focus Areas of Kindergarten

- Are able to use words to describe their own feelings
- Has expressive language
- Uses all parts of speech
- Knows number names and the count sequence up to 100
- Learn about numbers 11-20, with tens and ones
- Compare numbers and groups
- Understand that addition is putting together groups and adding to groups
- Recognize and name all upper and lowercase letters.
- Use phonics when reading words
- Say the most frequent sounds for each consonant and vowel
- Read common high-frequency words by sight

Enrollment

- The first day of school is August 19, 2024.
- Application for Lottery Enrollment for 2024-2025 is scheduled to open on February 9th, 2024 @ 3:00pm and close March 15th at 11:55pm.
 Please continue to check the NMUSD website for updates on enrollment for the next school year.
 - Students must be age 5 on or before September 1, 2024 to enroll in Kindergarten.
 - Students who will be age 5 between September 2, 2024 to April 2, 2025 (inclusive) may enroll in Transitional Kindergarten (TK) <u>OR</u> one of NMUSD's preschool classrooms.
 - Students who will be age 5 after April 2, 2025 may enroll in one of the NMUSD preschool classrooms.

Kindergarten Readiness

- Reading and Language Skills
 - Able to write his/her name.
 - Identify 20/30 letters (Upper and lowercase) out of order.
 - Speak using complete sentences
 - Recognizes familiar logos and signs, like stop signs
- Math
 - Count to ten without skipping numbers
 - Understand "more than" and "less than"
 - Can name basic shapes (square, circle, triangle, rectangle).
- Social and Emotional Skills
 - Separate from parents easily
 - Follows direction
 - Asks for help
- Fine Motor Skills
 - Grip a pencil, crayon, or marker correctly (with the thumb and forefinger supporting the tip)
 - Use scissors, glue, paint, and other art materials with relative ease

What should I be doing now?

- Building Independence
 - Getting dressed
 - Tying shoes
 - Buckle and unbuckle car seat
 - \circ Open their own food containers
 - Help/involved in packing backpack and snacks
 - Advocate for self
- Love for Learning
 - \circ Read to your child
 - Share nursery rhymes, songs, dances
 - Celebrating all of your child's attempts
- Social and Emotional Skills
 - Naming feelings
 - Talk about feelings
 - Play school
- Fine Motor Skills
 - Play with playdough
 - Beading
 - Access to school supplies

Physical within 12 months with TB risk assessment and current immunizations.



Special Healthcare Needs

Medical form for any medications needed at school. Please share with the health office if your child has any allergies or any chronic conditions.



Mandatory Screenings

Vision and Hearing





Please keep your child home if they are showing any symptoms and call the school.



VACCINE REQUIREMENTS

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap, or Td) 5 doses (4 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday.)
- Polio (OPV or IPV) 4 doses

(3 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday)

- Hepatitis B 3 doses
- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) 2 doses (Both given on or after 1st birthday)
- Varicella (Chickenpox) 2 doses

Parents must show their child's Immunization Record as proof of immunization.

All students with a Vaccine Exemption will need a new Medical Vaccine Exemption to start school. For more information about this requirement please go to https://cair.cdph.ca.gov/exemptions/home.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Proof of a physical examination & TB screening done within 6 months before the first day of school.
