ELA	<p>Kiersten Widmer came on October 12th and 13th. Teachers received embedded PD through coaching within their lessons. They then debriefed on next steps and goals for the school year.</p>
Math	<p>Charlene Marchese will be coming this week, October 25th and 26th to work with our sixth grade teachers. The focus will be how things are going with Eureka Squared and any support the teachers need within the unit and lessons. 7th and 8th grade teachers will be planning with Charlene and receive embedded coaching in the classroom which will be focused on creating tasks that require deeper understanding of the math concept.</p> <p>In Science, transitioning over to the NexGen Science Standards 7th Grade students completed their investigations. They worked diligently and did an amazing job! This demonstrates the teachers worked to clearly align their curriculum and students were well prepared.</p> <p>During October department meetings, we discussed common lesson structure as well as common language which teachers will be working on.</p>
SEL/School Climate	<p>Counselors have begun pushing in for monthly SEL lessons for all three grade levels.
