## What is Title 1?

The **purpose** of this title is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

The Title I program offers a variety of services which may include: additional teachers and support staff, extra time for instruction, a variety of teaching methods and materials, smaller classes and additional training for staff.

**School-Wide Requirements** include:

- Comprehensive Needs Assessment– The school must identify areas of greatest need.
- School-wide reform strategies.
- Strengthen the core academic program.
- Increase the amount and quality of learning time.
- Develop strategies for meeting needs of underserved populations.
- Address needs of all, but particularly low-achieving students.
- Instruction by highly qualified teachers.
- Professional Development Opportunities

Schools **qualify** for funds based on economic need.

## Parental Involvement

### Shared Decision Making

You can help make important decisions about your child's school by participating in School Improvement Council meetings, PTO meetings and Title I meetings.

Parent activities, workshops, and trainings are developed around responses to the annual parent survey, as well as needs

**Parent rights** include:

- knowing the professional qualifications of their child's teachers, including the degrees and certifications held, and whether the teacher is certified in his/her respective area of instruction

- knowing the school improvement status
- knowing the level of achievement of their child in each area of the state assessment
