

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

YOU MAY APPLY FOR OPEN ENROLLMENT FROM FEBRUARY 5 - APRIL 30, 2024.

What is Public School Open Enrollment?

Wisconsin's public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend a school district other than the one in which they live. Applications may be submitted to up to three nonresident school districts if the pupil wishes to attend a brick and mortar school. There are no limitations to the number of open enrollment applications that can be submitted to a virtual charter school.

How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment regular application period for the 2024-25 school year is from February 5-April 30, 2024. The application period closes at 4:00pm on April 30, 2024. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

Parents may apply online at https://dpi.wi.gov/oe.

Can I apply to a virtual charter school under open enrollment?

A pupil may only open enroll to an online/virtual school if: (1) the school has been created as a virtual charter school that meets the requirements of the charter school law [Wis. Stats. 118.40 (8)] or (2) the pupil is required to physically attend school on a regular basis in a school located in the nonresident school district on the days that school is in session. Other important things to know about applying to virtual charter schools:

- A virtual charter school is not homeschooling. Pupils attending virtual charter schools are public school pupils.
- You must know the nonresident school district in which the virtual charter school is located.
- You must know your resident school district to apply.
- A list of virtual charter schools may be found at <u>https://</u> dpi.wi.gov/parental-education-options/charter-schools/ virtual-charter-schools.

Parents whose applications are denied may appeal to the DPI within 30 days of the denial. State law requires the DPI to uphold the school district's decision unless DPI finds that the decision was arbitrary or unreasonable. The DPI's decision may be appealed to circuit court.

Who may participate in open enrollment? Pupils in kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment.

Open enrollment for prekindergarten, four-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for open enrollment.

Can an application be rejected?

Nonresident school districts may deny an application if regular or special education space is not available for the pupil; special education or related services are not available; or if the pupil has been referred for a special education evaluation but has not yet been evaluated. Nonresident school districts may also deny an application if the pupil has been expelled during the current or preceding two years for certain violent conduct or if the pupil was habitually truant from the nonresident school district during any semester in the current or previous school year.

If there are more applications than spaces, pupils must be selected randomly, after giving preference to pupils already attending school in the nonresident school district and siblings of currently-attending pupils.

Some school districts establish waiting lists to fill unused spaces, but others do not.

Can a resident district prevent a pupil from leaving?

A resident district can deny a pupil's application for an invalid application (early or late application or missing information), ineligibility due to age (too young or too old), or if the resident district does not offer the same type of prekindergarten, four-year-old kindergarten, or early childhood program as the nonresident district or the pupil is not eligible for the program in the resident district. These are also reasons that a nonresident district can deny an application.

Can parents appeal if an application is denied? Must pupils reapply every year?

Once a pupil is accepted into a nonresident school district, the pupil may continue to attend that district without reapplication except that:

- The nonresident district may require a pupil to reapply one time at the beginning of middle school, junior high or high school.
- A pupil may be returned to the resident school district if the special education required in a new or revised IEP is not available in the nonresident district or there is no space.
- A pupil who has become habitually truant in the nonresident district may be returned to the resident district.

Is there a cost for parents to participate in the open enrollment program?

There is no tuition cost to parents for participation in open enrollment. Parents of open enrolled pupils may be charged the same fees as resident pupils.

Who is responsible for transportation?

Parents are responsible for transporting their children to and from school.

If transportation is required in the IEP for a child with a disability, it must be provided by the nonresident district.

School districts may provide transportation to open enrollment pupils if they wish. Usually, if transportation is provided, parents must transport the pupil to a location in the nonresident district.

Low-income parents may apply to the DPI at the end of the school year for partial reimbursement of their transportation costs.



Can a parent select a specific school in the pupil's nonresident school district?

Yes. A parent may request a specific school or program in the nonresident district. However, assignment to the requested school or program is not guaranteed and your pupil may be assigned to a different school other than the one requested. It is up to each nonresident district to determine a pupil's school assignment.

Can an open enrolled pupil participate in sports and other extra-curricular activities in the nonresident school district?

Open enrolled pupils have the same rights and responsibilities as resident pupils.

Inter-scholastic athletics are governed by the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA), which has rules concerning transfer pupils. Parents should check with the school district's athletic director about eligibility.

IMPORTANT OPEN ENROLLMENT DATES

February 5 - April 30, 2024

Parents must submit applications online or directly to the nonresident school district.

June 7, 2024

Nonresident school districts must send notices of approval or denial via US mail or email. If the application is approved, the school district must notify the parents of the specific school or program to which the pupil is assigned. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 14, 2024

Resident districts must notify applicants if the application is denied. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 28, 2024


Parents of accepted applicants must notify the nonresident district if the pupil will attend the nonresident district in the 2024-25 school year. If the parent fails to make this notification, the nonresident district may refuse to allow the pupil to attend the district.



SCHOOL DISTRICT OF BLACK HAWK

REGULAR MEETING

DECEMBER 13, 2023



The meeting was called to order at 6:03 pm in the Business Room by President Dee Paulson. The following were present Kerry Holland, Jim Baumgartner, Clayton Ruegsegger, Mindy Stauffacher, Val Dunlavey, Dee Paulson and Jason Figi. Motion by Holland and seconded by Figi to consent to agenda but moving the volunteer coaches to after executive. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Administration Reports:

Chambers:

- We have interviewed three people already and will interview another for the Business Education Position.
- I have attached data that was requested about the Revenue from NFHS. Thank you to Tammy for pulling this
 out of Skyward.
- I have included the language for: Drawing of Lots for Ballot Order for Placement on the Spring Primary Ballot
 or, Where No Primary is required, for Placement on the Spring Election Ballot. In essence, it needs to be done
 before the next meeting. I recommend the names not be drawn by someone who will be on the ballot, but
 according to the attachment, it is to be supervised by the clerk.

Milz:

- I would like to thank Mr. Eric Amweg, Ms. Maggie Setterstrom, and all the other teachers who assisted in
 putting together our Veteran's Day Program this past November. It was an excellent program.
- I would like to thank Mr. Travis Skattum, commander of the Gratiot VFW post for being our guest speaker.
- On November 17, Ms. Kammes, our middle school student council advisor, took some of the middle school student council members to a Leadership Tour conference, where they learned about public speaking and how to make a difference in their local school community.
- Since moving the office intercom system, we had some issues with our WAVE emergency response system.
 SecureTech came on Nov. 30 and updated the system and ensured that it is working properly.
- Want to thank Melissa Pickett for spearheading the communities' Santa's Elves charity giving event and to all those staff members who supported our area families.
- The local charity program, The Backpack Program that was created by community member Summer Stietz is being continued by Haley Larse, Monica Yates-Olson, Kali Schliem and three of our staff members: Travis Signer, Tiffany Signer, and Melissa Pickett. Huge thanks to them for continuing this amazing community, charity program.
- We are currently interviewing four candidates for the posted business education position.
- Winter Holiday concert performances are coming up on Monday, December 18 with the 4K-5th grade concert at 1:30 p.m. and the MS/HS concert at 7:00 p.m.
- According to our grading retest policy that the teacher's agreed upon; January 3, 2024 was communicated to students as the last day to accept reassessments on those assessments that took place prior to January 3, 2024
- High school final exams are set for January 16 and January 18, due to the 17th being a release for
 professional collaboration.

AD Director - Mr. Erickson:

- Winter Sports Boys and Girls basketball are now in full swing. The boys have 22 (11 upperclassmen and 11 underclassmen-playing JV) on the team right now. The girls have 14 with 4 seniors, 4 juniors, 4 sophomores and 2 freshmen. We have hosted several games and the kids are competing hard.
 - Wrestling has also started and we have 1 girl and 4 boys competing. We also host a match here on Friday night.
 - I have concern for our girls' basketball numbers in the coming years and feel we need to either see a drastic change in the numbers of girls at the lower level or we will need to seek a coop or not offer a JV team. This is not a unique problem to Black Hawk.
 - I have worked with the coaches to make some changes in their schedules and get information into the hands
 of parents. It's been a dance but we're all learning.
 - We did have a meeting for prospective softball and baseball players with the Argyle coaches. They were
 attended but with Flex pass many upper level students were not in attendance.
 - I'm scheduling interviews with two individuals who have expressed interest in being the assistant coach and Black Hawk representative for the softball coop.
 - The golf coop was discussed on numerous occasions and we just received admin approval from Pec and Argyle for our boys to play JV with them this spring. I had an interest sign up and had three individuals interested.
 - The boys' basketball team will travel to Elkhart Lake for a tournament over break. Securing rooms and transportation has been interesting. Approval previously??
 - I'm having back surgery next Monday and will be out of commission for a couple of weeks. I've tried to get
 coverage for game management and that's still in progress... But I have hope. Our workers have been great
 and faithful.

Board of Education Report was called for none.

Public comment was called for Cory Milz spook on Administration being a coach and gave examples of current coaches who are Administrators. Milz also voiced that Policy 9130 wasn't followed when a concern was brought forth by a board member.

Ms. Ruegsegger - speaking an aide that for many different reasons staff have been out and she wanted to voice appreciation and support from Board and Administration for supporting the staff needs.

Talk was had about Sub-Pay and it was decided that we would keep it the same. \$125/Day and after 10 Days it will be \$200/Day. No action was taken on it.

Motion by Holland and seconded by Stauffacher to approve audit report prepared by Hawkins and Ash dated October 23, 2023. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Dunlavey and seconded by Baumgartner to approve Mid-Year office Retreat for FFA on January 5-7, 2024 in Iowa City. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Dunlavey and seconded by Stauffacher to approve half-time retreat for FFA in Stevens Point on January 12-13, 2024. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Figi to approve a Golf Co-op with Argyle. Discussion was had about transportation and what we would do and it will have to be figured out yet. The motion carried on a voice vote. Motion by Dunlavey and seconded by Baumgartner to approve allowing Maddox Hocking allowing him to wrestle for Black Hawk Darlington. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Holland and seconded by Ruegsegger approve the resignation of Josh Firgens as Business Teacher/FBLA Advisor and must pay any penalties per staff handbook/contract. The motion carried on a voice.

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Stauffacher to rescind the motion of hiring Gina Bacher as a teacher's aide. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Based on feedback from Nikki Smith and Rebecca Neff we do not need to hire an additional aide at this time. Motion by Dunlavey and seconded by Holland to allow the hiring of an additional aide when needed. Motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Figi to go into executive session at 7:01 pm. The president announced the purpose of the executive session under 19.85(1) items b, c, and f Personnel. The motion carried on a roll call vote. YES- Holland, Ruegsegger, Baumgartner, Dunlavey, Stauffacher, Paulson and Figi - NO-NONE.

The board returned to open session at 7:31 pm

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Figi to approve Kristen Eckerman as Volunteer Girls Basketball Coach. Motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Stauffacher to approve Nathanial Eaton as Volunteer Girls Basketball Coach. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Ruegsegger to approve Cory Milz as Volunteer Girls Basketball Coach. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Motion by Baumgartner and seconded by Dunlavey to adjourn at 7:34 pm. The motion carried on a voice vote.






