Dr. Mark Daniel, superintendent, presented the following information and recommendations concerning awards and recognitions:

Healthy Kids Healthy Future Innovation Challenge

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board recognize Kamiah Fomby as a finalist in the 2023 Healthy Kids Healthy Future Innovation Challenge. Parkview Health, in collaboration with MATTER, presented this competition.

RELATED INFORMATION: The Healthy Kids Healthy Future Innovation Challenge is a global innovation challenge inviting innovators and start-ups from around the globe to pitch solutions to improve children and teen health.

Kamiah Fomby was recognized as one of eight finalists in the challenge. She is the youngest competitor in the competition's history and was the only black female finalist. Kamiah's app prototype called, "One Day at a Time" focuses on empowering teens and young adults to overcome stigmas with a sense of belonging and community.

RELATED INFORMATION: Indiana law requires that projects over \$100,000 make use of a registered architect or a professional engineer for developing plans and specifications. Project architects/engineers need to be appointed now to allow sufficient time for planning and bidding of the projects. The projects will be funded with a combination of Operations Fund, which is identified in the Capital Projects Plan, and 2020 School Building Basic Renewal/Restoration and Safety Project (Bond).

The contract procurement method for the Miami Middle School Renovation is the Construction Manager as Constructor (CMc) for publicly funded projects as allowable per I.C. 5-32. The recommendation includes the design services contract based on a percentage of construction value, as well as a fixed fee for Contractor pre-construction services. An additional recommendation will be presented at a later date with the establishment of a final guaranteed maximum price for the project.

Darren Hess, Director of Facilities, was available to answer questions.

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Short and Long-Term Disability & Life Renewal:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve New York Life's proposed renewal offer, which would extend the rates currently in force on the Short-Term Disability and Long-Term Disability plans through January 31, 2026.

It was also recommended that the Board approve a two-year rate extension with Symetra Life Insurance Company for Life Insurance renewal.

Short and Long-Term Disability & Life Renewal **RELATED INFORMATION:** New York Life's current in-force rates became effective February 1, 2022.

- The Short-Term Disability rate remains \$0.178 per \$10 of weekly benefit for the plan.
- Long-Term Disability rates remains \$0.275 per \$100 of covered payroll covering eligible teachers, administrators, and supervisory employees.
- Long-Term Disability rates remains \$0.100 per \$100 of covered payroll covering eligible classified staff.

This agreement may be extended beyond January 31, 2026, subject to the agreement of the vendor, provided there are no additional price increase adjustments or changes to the terms of the contract.

Symetra Life Insurance Company guaranteed life insurance rates for three years in 2019. Based on experience ratings, Symetra is offering a two-year rate extension of \$.083 per \$1,000 of covered payroll through January 31, 2026.

Rose Costello, Executive Director of Human Resources was available to answer questions.

Board Member Steve Corona enjoyed the premeeting concert from Memorial Park. Happy holidays to the rest of the Board and all FWCS staff.

Board Member Julie Hollingsworth thanked Colleen Phillips and Memorial Park for their concert and extended Colleen's thankfulness for bInstrumental for their assistance in getting instruments to these students. Member Hollingsworth appreciates member Matthias putting herself out there to run for City Council. She wishes more people would participate. Ms. Hollingsworth wished the best of luck to teachers and staff for the last nine days before break.

Board Member Noah Smith said he dittoed to what everyone had said earlier in comments.

Superintendent Dr. Mark Daniel said that FWCS is very fortunate to have the classes we have. Christmas has come early in a lot of ways this year between the passing of the referendum, state championships, the areas of Schools of Success and community partnerships. As a Board you know how important it is to be involved and having a Board working in the same direction. Superintendent Daniel hopes everyone enjoys their holiday. There will be some variance in high schools for Schools of Success and there will be a parent FAQ to help explain details. Dr. Daniel is encouraging teachers to promote their programs.

Board President Maria Norman stated that one of the main functions of the Board is to evaluate the Superintendent. The Board is giving a 3% raise to Dr. Daniel, which is in-line with what other staff

increase was this year, plus an additional \$5,000. Ms. Noman thanked Ms. Emma and her students for the holiday card given to all Board members. President Norman also thanked Memorial Park for adjusting their school performance schedule so that they could perform this evening prior to the Board meeting.
