Middle School Placement Information Mathematics

Students in sixth, seventh, and eighth grade at the middle school can be recommended for various levels and courses based on their performance in math. A committee of teachers and administrators analyze student performance data each Spring to select the appropriate placement for each student. Grade	Determining Data
Placement for 6th - 7th Grade Math	During the spring of the 6 th grade year, Randolph Middle School teachers make determinations of 7 th grade placement based on several factors: Winter MAP score, NJSLA score, most recent skills assessment score, 6 th grade assessment average, and assignment completion. Students will receive points based on criteria that will determine where teachers recommend students to be placed for 7th grade math. Students can select a level lower than what a teacher recommends. Students and parents also can submit a waiver to request Pre-Algebra 7 Honors. Students and parents will not have the option to waive into Algebra I Honors in 7th grade.
Placement for 7th - 8th Grade Math	During the spring of the 7th grade year, Randolph Middle School teachers make determinations of 8th grade placement based on several factors: most recent math placement, Winter MAP scores, NJSLA score, 7th Grade assessment average, and assignment completion. Students will receive points based on criteria that will determine where teachers recommend students to be placed for 8th grade math. Students can select a level lower than what a teacher recommends.
Placement for 9th Grade Math	During the spring of the 8th grade year, Randolph Middle School teachers make determinations of 9th grade placement based on several factors: Winter MAP scores, NJSLA score, most recent math placement, 8th grade assessments average, and assignment completion. Students will receive points based on criteria that will determine where teachers recommend students to be placed for 9th grade math. Students can select a level lower than what a teacher recommends.
