 - Friday Night Live/Club Live
 - 7 student clubs @ 5 middle schools and 2 high schools (used to have 12-13 kids pre covid) tough getting schools back on board.
 - Meet weekly. Tabling events @ lunch time/visit stores (hold accountable for displays etc.)
 - o Attend leadership workshops. Give data and prevention info. to students @ schools.
 - o 28-30 Secondary schools where we CAN have schools.
 - o New tobacco cessation program (N.O.T.) La Entrada/El Camino/?
 - New Program includes vaping
 - Paula Erfert interested in info. on new N.O.T. program
 - Teen Intervene sessions have had nearly a decade
 - 1:1 program facilitators can get students to open up more.
 - No longer have Sac State Interns to help with this.
 - Have been training site staff to deliver 3 sessions.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL - Natalee. Dyudyuk

- Grant program implemented through CalTrans (Civic Thread also).
 - Currently at Mission Ave sharing bike safety with kids through 6th grade.
 - Events walk to school on National Walk and Bike Oct. 4th. City of Citrus Heights Kingswood K-8 Oct. 8th (140 students).
 - Last year we did up-dating on Wellness policy via WSCC w/ Gaylon regarding Safe Routes to School. Reached out to Safe Routes Partnership (nationally based) work on providing and collaborate on 3 hour virtual training workshop (Jan after winter break). Invite WSCC to join.
 - Looking to collaborate with local govt. organizations to make it more institutionalized. Additional funding possible? Next steps.

California Healthy Kids Survey Update – Gaylon Johnson – Mandated Statewide Survey

- Results last year did 3 year comparison 2016-17 18-19 and 20-21
- Sample of comparisons this year:
 - Cigarette down/Marijuana 34% some down 2022-23 from 2018-19
 - o Tobacco Vape same/slightly up
 - Marijuana Vape higher (near double @ NT)
 - o Occasional Marijuana use perceived as harmful? higher NT is lower: most students perceive it is NOT harmful.
 - o Heavy Alcohol use?: Down for all except NT (up 12%)
 - o Engaged in heavy drug use? Same/down for most (NT @ 32%)
 - o Feel Safe? ALL DROPPED
 - O Harrassed in last 12 mos? Most UP. NT went from 9% to 27%.
 - o Cyberbullying in past 12mos? UP
 - o Feel connected to school? NT up @ 58% others down
 - Next CHKS 2024-25
