182 **Spanish Culture Through Film**

1 term 1/4 credit

Pre: none

Grade level: 10-12

Course Summary: In this course, students will study Spanish and Latin American culture through film. We will learn about and discuss cultural topics from a variety of Spanish speaking countries.

183 **Spanish Medical Terminology**

1 term 1/4 credit

Pre: successful completion of Spanish 1 AND 2 with a B or above in each

Grade level: 10-12

Course Summary: This course will allow students to learn Spanish vocabulary centered around healthcare, medicine, and anatomy. Topics include the human body, diseases and illnesses, and how to address a patient. The focus will be learning and expanding vocabulary.

184 **Hispanic Myths and Legends**

1 term 1/4 credit

Pre: successful completion of Spanish 1 and 2 with a B or above in each

Grade level: 10-12

Course Summary: In this course, students will explore myths and legends from Latin America while practicing their Spanish. This course will focus on building fluency through speaking and reading while learning new vocab each week.

191 **Spanish IA**

192 **Spanish IB**

4 terms 1 credit

Pre: A grade of "C" or above in English is recommended.

Grade Level: 9 - 12

Course Summary: Students will be introduced to basic conversational Spanish and topics such as food, clothing and friends. Classroom activities include reading, writing, listening and speaking. Activities will be created for all different learning styles. ***Please register for all 4 terms.**

193 **Spanish IIA**

194 **Spanish IIB**

4 terms 1 credit

Pre: Successful completion of Spanish I with a C is recommended

Grade Level: 9 - 12

Course Summary: Students will build on knowledge learned in Spanish I by working on reading, speaking, listening, and writing skills. Students will develop a deeper understanding of the language through the exploration of grammar. ***Please register for all 4 terms.**

195 Spanish IIIA

196 Spanish IIIB

2 terms 1/2 credit each course

Pre: Successful completion of Spanish II with C or above or instructor approval.

Grade Level: 10 - 12

Course Summary: Students will review previous grammar and will be introduced to more advanced grammar through reading, writing, listening and speaking skill practice. A variety of activities similar to Spanish I and II will be part of this course. ***Please register for all 4 terms**

197 Spanish IVA

197A Spanish IVB

4 terms 1/2 credit each course

Pre: Successful completion of Spanish III with a "C" or above

Grade Level: 11 - 12

Course Summary: Students will further develop their Spanish speaking skills within practical "real world" settings. While developing a more advanced foundation of grammar and vocabulary through reading, writing, listening, and speaking, the focus will be placed upon functional, conversational Spanish. Students achieve the skills needed to successfully converse in the context of travel, shopping, emergency situations, medical attention, and other practical situations that take place within common, day to day settings. ***Please register for all 4 terms**

198 AP Spanish

4 terms 1 credit (weighted)

Pre: Successful completion of Spanish IV or with teacher approval

Grade Level: 12

Course Summary: The AP Spanish Language and Culture course is an advanced class taught exclusively in Spanish that requires students to improve their proficiency across all forms of communication. Students will use authentic materials such as newspapers, magazines and other audiovisual resources to reinforce and advance their communication skills in Spanish. Upon completion of the course, students will be able to take the AP test to determine eligibility for college credit.

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
