## **2.S. Annual Review of School Board Policies - Instruction 4.501 - 4,805**

**3. SCHOOL DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS: Rotary Club Food Drive** – Chris Gregory, President of the Rotary Club, was present to award the 2024 Thanksgiving Food Drive trophy to Ms. Badru and the elementary school students. Mr. Gregory stated that the club collected over 10,000 food items for the Trousdale County Food Bank.

### **4. PRINCIPALS' REPORTS:**

**4.A. Trousdale County Elementary School** – Ms. Badru stated that the school presently has (717) students enrolled in grades PreK – 5<sup>th</sup> grade with (101) students in 5<sup>th</sup> grade. She stated the school is presently averaging (39) student absences per day with stomach viruses, strep throat, and flu being the leading cause of illnesses at the school. She said the school sponsored a door decoration contest with the math tutor teachers winning the overall first prize. Ms. Badru said she has been working to encourage student attendance during the last weeks of school by providing theme and dress up days during each day in December. She stated that the middle school cheerleaders provided a school pep rally today for which the students had a wonderful time. Academically, Ms. Badru discussed the administration of the Tripod student perception surveys, administration of the Q2 formative benchmark assessments, and preparation for upcoming reading screener assessments scheduled for early January. She concluded by informing the Board that TCAT had recently provided all second and third grade students with a career readiness book to keep and take home.

**4.B. Jim Satterfield Middle School** – Mr. McCall described the administration of the Tripod student perception surveys that had been administered since Thanksgiving break, noting how the results are used in the teachers' annual evaluations. Mr. McCall discussed how the most recent Q2 formative benchmark assessments are used to inform instruction going forward into the next semester. He stated that student attendance has improved during the benchmark window which helps reduce time for makeup assessments with only (28) students absent on the last day of the semester. Mr. McCall highlighted the successes of the basketball teams, stating that both the boys and girls teams will be playing in the James C. Haile State tournament in January. Mr. McCall concluded that the school has experienced a really good semester.

**4.C. Trousdale County High School** – Dr. Kuhn stated that there have been some technical issues with the benchmark platform; however, the school was able to complete all benchmark assessments by the last day of the semester. Dr. Kuhn stated that presently students are making surprisingly good academic growth as compared to the same time last year. He informed the Board that the Trousdale Emergency Services completed CPR certification for all the wellness students at the high school. Dr. Kuhn concluded that the school's enrollment is steady with (389) students.

**4.D. Student School Board Representative** – Kallie Cornwell updated the Board about the successes of the school's basketball teams. She highlighted the school's Christmas classroom door contest for which first prize was awarded to Ms. Oliver's class, second prize to Ms. Holder's class, and third prize to Ms. Cook's classroom. She described some of the fun activities including "reindeer games" in which the students participated on the last day of the semester.

**5.B. Academic and Goal Updates** – Dr. Satterfield stated that the student enrollment is up (20) more students as compared to the same time in 2022, noting that the majority of increases are located at the elementary school. He reminded everyone of the Christmas breakfast Friday morning that is sponsored by Wilson Bank & Trust. He stated that the Q2 formative benchmark assessments and the Tripod student perception surveys have been completed at all three schools. He stated that (17) students participated in the National ACT testing day on December 9<sup>th</sup> and that the TN ALL Corps tutoring for K-2 and 4<sup>th</sup> graders is working well in conjunction with the AfterSchool Academy. Dr. Satterfield informed the Board that the new A-F school designations are scheduled to be released for the first time on December 21<sup>st</sup> for which new metrics such as TVAAS growth for the highest need students have been added to the state school accountability model. Dr. Satterfield concluded that the new 2024-25 school district calendar will be selected later in the meeting and would be posted on the school district website on Friday.

**5.C. Project Updates** – Dr. Satterfield updated the Board on the progress of the new greenhouse, stating that the fire marshal's inspection is scheduled for tomorrow while the architect's final inspection is scheduled for the first week of January. He reminded everyone of the on-going work with the architect to have elementary roof and football fieldhouse bid documents available in February or March.
