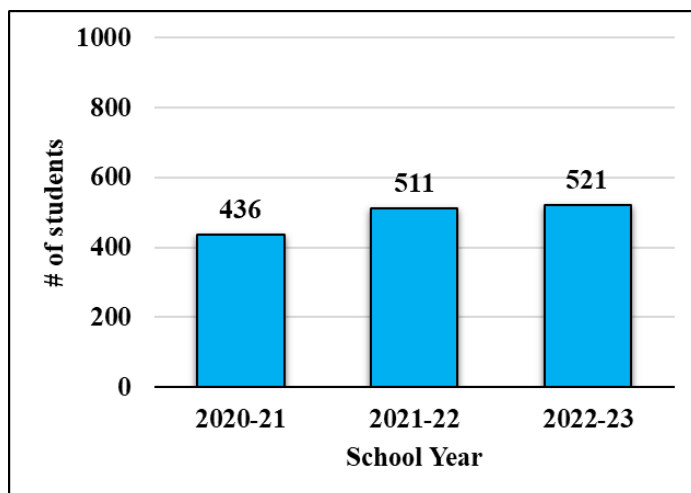

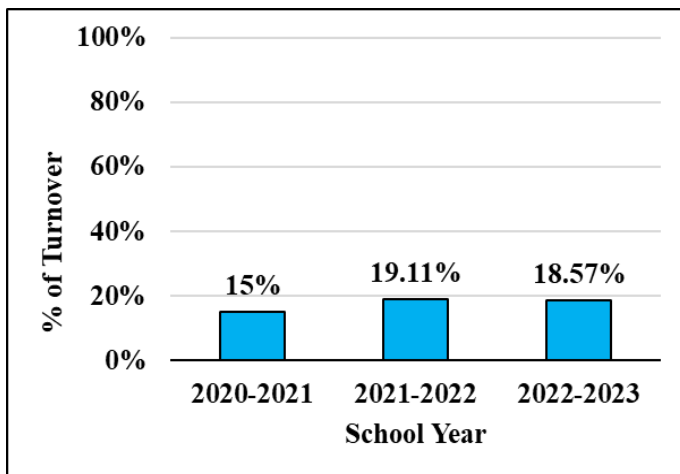

Student Academics and Literacy

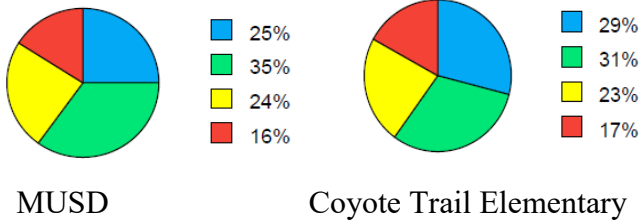
At Coyote Trail, we use student performance and data to inform our planning. Students are exposed to grade level standards, as well as learning at their individual level of instruction. The State of Arizona has a Move on When Reading statute designed to position students for success as they progress through school, college, and career. As a part of this law, students are required to meet certain reading benchmarks in order to be promoted to the fourth grade. In MUSD, we use Acadience Reading to help teachers identify children at risk for reading difficulties and determine the skills to target for instructional support. We are pleased to report that **ALL of our third grade students met the Move on When Reading requirements** this past school year and were promoted to fourth

grade!

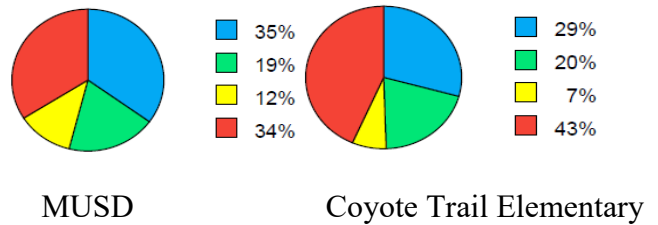

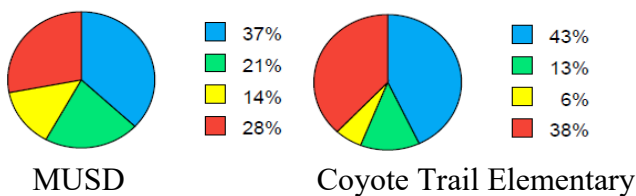
Kindergarten End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores



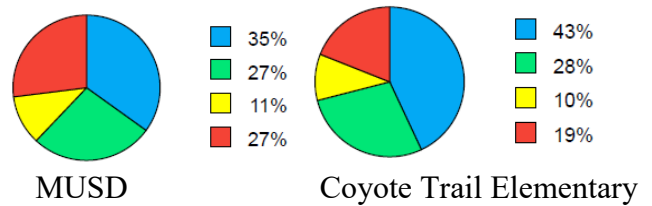
1st Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores



2nd Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores



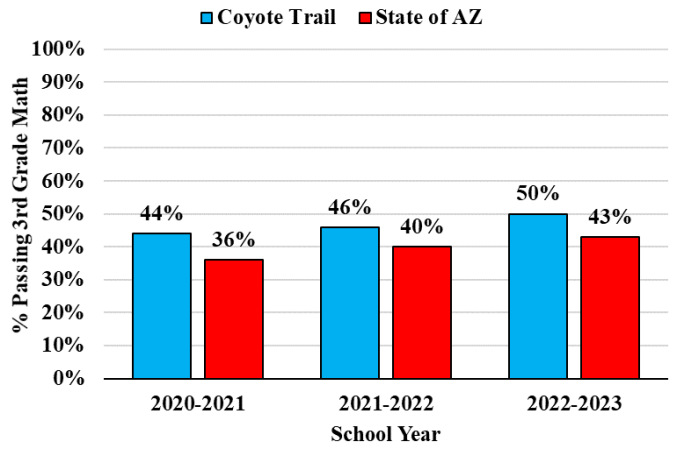
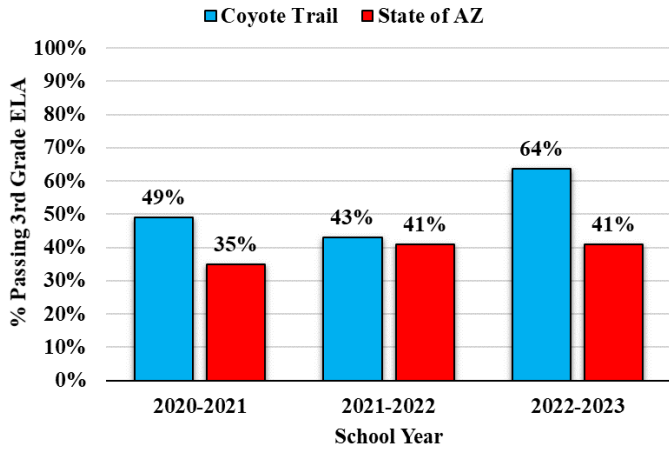
3rd Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores



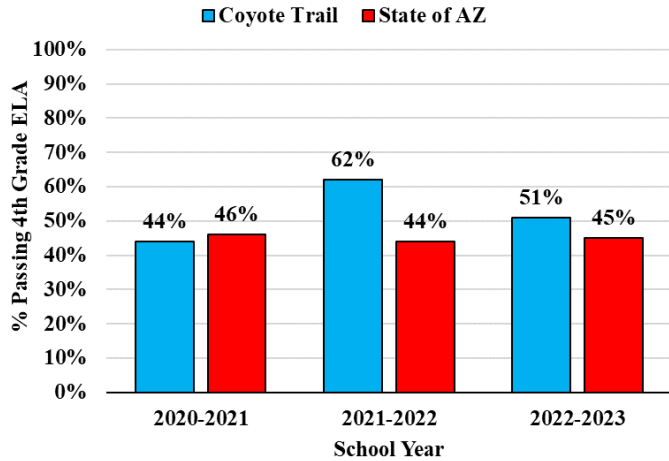

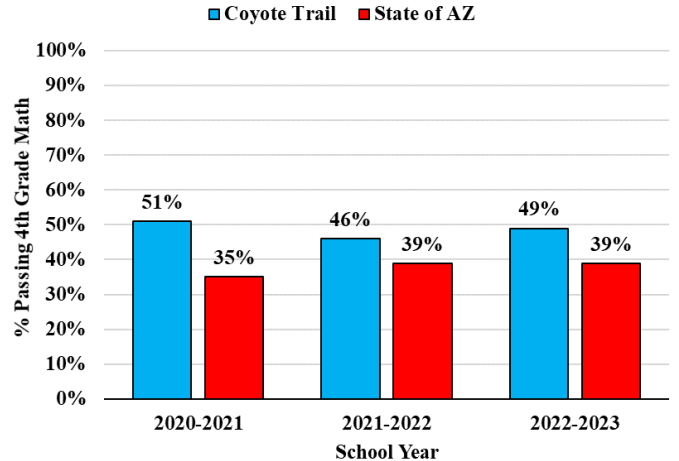

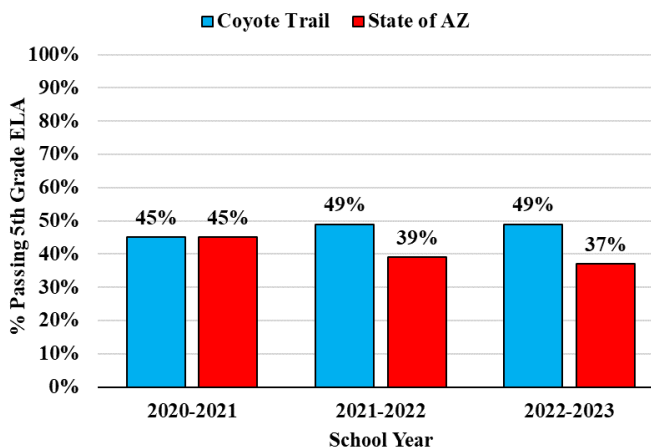

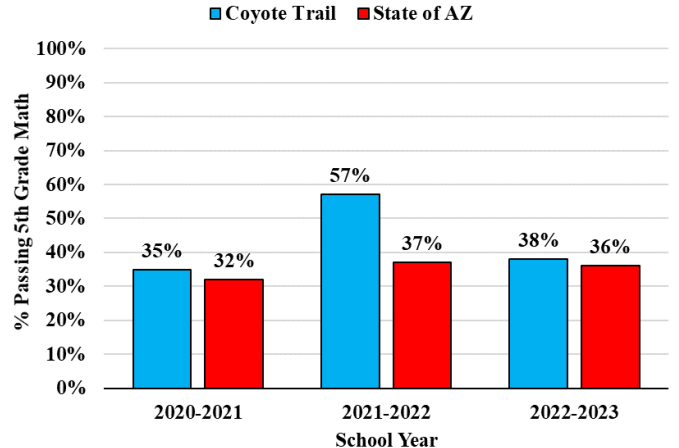

4th Grade Math:



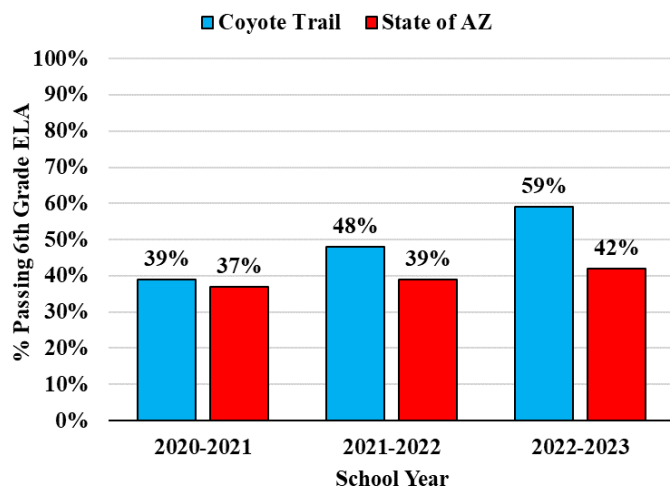

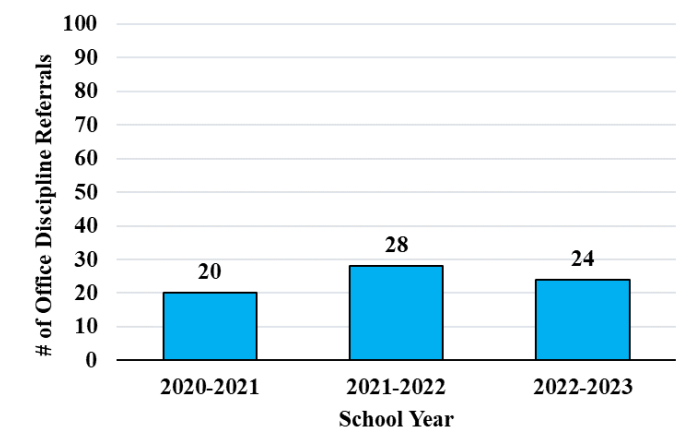
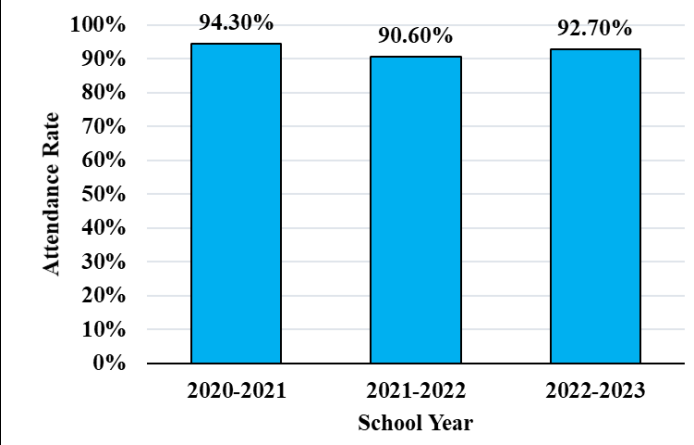
State of Arizona Letter Grade: Coyote Trail Elementary School currently has a "A" letter grade from the Arizona Department of Education.
