### 1. Positive Behaviors, Interventions, and Supports

O Gladden Farms is excited to share that we support students, staff, and families with our Positive Behaviors, Interventions, and Supports (PBIS). GFE incorporates four commitments that pair with PBIS: Respect, Responsibility, Kindness, and Safety. Through these four commitments, students learn how to interact and build positive relationships with one another, how to behave in areas around campus, how to stay safe, and also how to treat others.

#### 2. Equitable Supports for Students

O Gladden Farms provides equitable support for all students. At Gladden, we believe each child can succeed. In order to accomplish this, we offer various programs that meet students at their academic and behavioral level. These programs include: Gifted Education, English Language Learner (ELL), Reading Supports, Accelerated Math, counselor support groups, and after school activities.

# 3. To help intentionally build a caring school community, our students enrich their learning with buddy classes.

 Having older and younger students interact in positive ways is especially important in a K-6 environment. Buddy classes meet monthly and connect through fun activities and games.

# 4. Gladden Farms is part of the National WATCH D.O.G.S (Dads of Great Students) Program.

- Dad's of Great Students is a national program that is a family and community engagement educational initiative. There are 2 primary goals of the WATCH D.O.G.S. program:
  - To provide positive male role models for the students, demonstrating by their presence that education is important
  - To provide extra sets of eyes and ears to enhance school security and reduce bullying. We currently have 8 male role models who are taking part in this program on our campus.




#### **Our Staff**

### **Student Academics and Literacy**


At Gladden Farms, we use student performance and data to inform our planning. Students are exposed to grade level standards, as well as learning at their individual level of instruction. The State

of Arizona has a Move on When Reading statute designed to position students for success as they progress through school, college, and career. As a part of this law, students are required to meet certain reading benchmarks in order to be promoted to the fourth grade. In MUSD, we use Acadience Reading to help teachers identify children at risk for reading difficulties and determine the skills to target for instructional support. We are pleased to report that **ALL of our third grade students met the Move on When Reading requirements** this school year and have been promoted to fourth grade!




# Kindergarten End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores




### 1st Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores



# **2nd Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores**




### 3rd Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores





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






# **Standardized Testing Performance 4th Grade ELA:**




## **Standardized Testing Performance 4th Grade Math:**









### **Standardized Testing Performance 5th Grade Math:**



# **Standardized Testing Performance 6th Grade ELA:**





# **Standardized Testing Performance 6th Grade Math:**



# Spring 2022 Standardized Testing Performance 5th Grade AzSCI:


<u>State of Arizona Letter Grade</u>: Gladden Farms Elementary School currently has a B letter grade from the Arizona Department of Education.






#### **On Track Indicators**

#### **ACTION STEPS TO SUSTAIN LEVEL ONE**

- We are cultivating a strong sense of community on campus by increasing staff recognitions, providing more opportunities for staff feedback and gathering informally throughout the year.
