School Highlights- Points of Pride

● Incredible Academic Success and Participation in State Assessments!

- We are so proud of our Mountain Lions! Over the past year at MVHS, our students have accepted the challenge of taking a wide variety of assessments. Some of these include:
 - The ACT – The class of 2024 took this their junior year in the spring of 2023;
 - Advanced Placement (AP) exams – MVHS took 439 AP exams in 22 different subjects in the spring of 2023;
 - Technical Skills Assessments (TSAs) – taken by students in our outstanding Career & Technical Education (CTE) programs, including JTED;
 - ASVAB – The classes of 2024 and 2025 have seen most of the students take the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test, a great assessments to highlight student strengths, skills, and career pathways;
 - The NAEP – MVHS was proud to represent on the National Assessment of Educational Progress, also known as the Nation's Report Card;
 - The AZ Civics test – To date, almost all students in the class of 2024 have fulfilled this graduation requirement!
- Assessments are an important part of how educators learn what students have learned. When students work hard to show what they know on these assessments, we can examine their learning, design interventions, and become a better place for kids. Thank you, Mountain Lions! Your hard work and dedication to your learning shows!

● The Mountain View Music Programs are the Heartbeat of our Campus.

- The MVHS music programs are truly the pride of Mountain View. Over the last three years our marching band membership has grown by 140% and our indoor percussion program membership has grown by 200%! In 2022, our indoor percussion program won state championships through the WGAZ circuit. Our marching band has also had record breaking seasons.

● **Mountain View paves the way with AIA-Sanctioned Girls' Flag Football in Southern Arizona!**

- Mountain View High School is one of two AIA-sanctioned girls' flag football programs in southern Arizona. Jane Nova, flag football head coach at MVHS, has shared the importance of being the first group of young women to bring the sport to Marana. "I tell them to enjoy the ride, because they are paving the way for all the girls behind them who want to play this amazing sport. They are making history." The addition of flag football as a sanctioned sport has created a space for girls to play football on a competitive level that could lead to post-high school opportunities.

Mountain View High School Student Programs

Academic Program Offerings: Mountain View High School offers programming to meet the needs of each learner at our school.

Advanced Placement: Mountain View High School offers **22** Advanced Placement (AP) courses. In 2022-2023 we administered **438 exams** to **266** students; **55% of these exams earned a passing score of 3 or higher!** Here are some of the AP courses available to MVHS students:

Dual Enrollment: Mountain View High School offers **six** dual enrollment courses to students through Pima Community College. This year **191** students earned college credit for participation in the following dual enrollment course at MVHS:

Supportive Academic Programs: At Mountain View High School our students with specialized academic and behavioral needs have access to supportive programs including:

Elective Courses: 100% of Mountain View High School students are required to earn credit in either a Fine Arts or a CTE elective to graduate. Students have the opportunity to select up to three electives each semester!

CTE Programs: During the 2022-2023 school year we had **1007** students enrolled in CTE courses. During the 2021-2022 school year we had **62** MVHS CTE students earn industry certifications in their program.

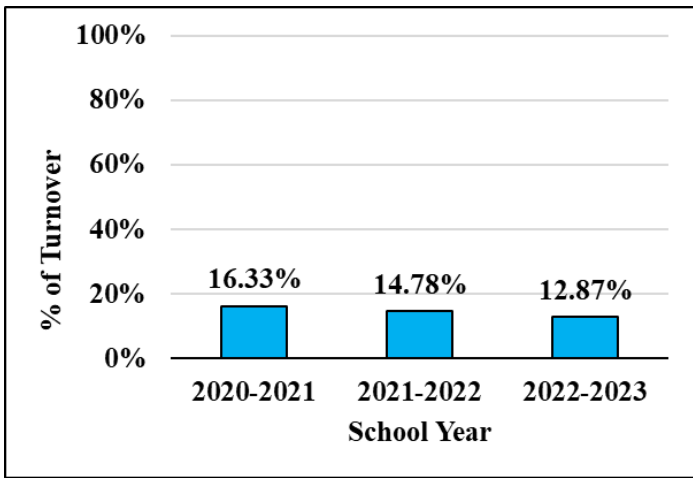

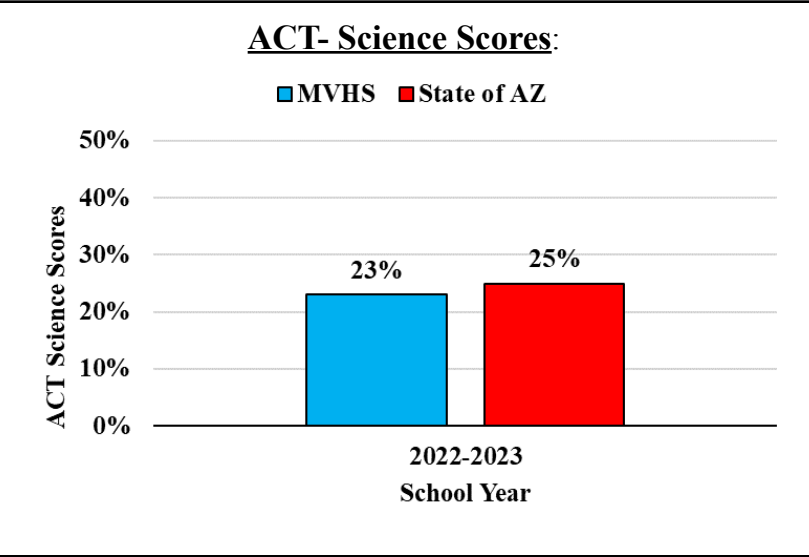

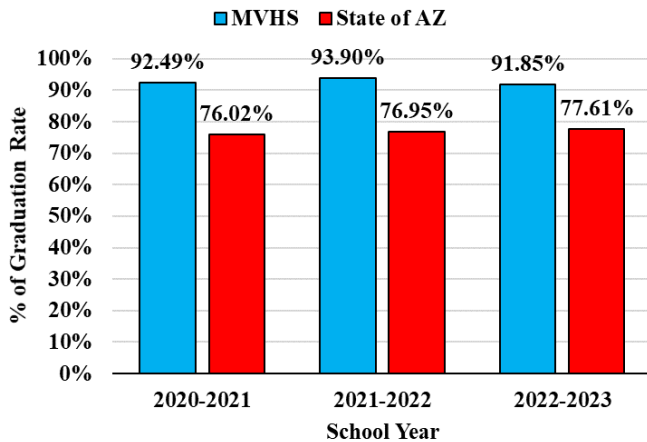

MVHS teachers participated in **3126.75** hours of professional learning during the 2022-2023 school year!

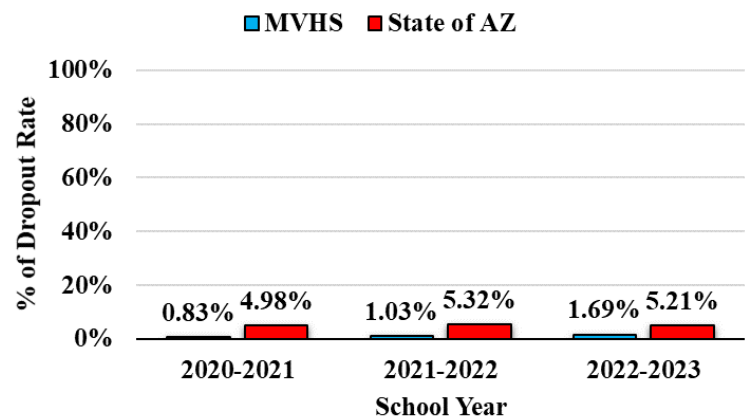
Student Academic and Success Measures



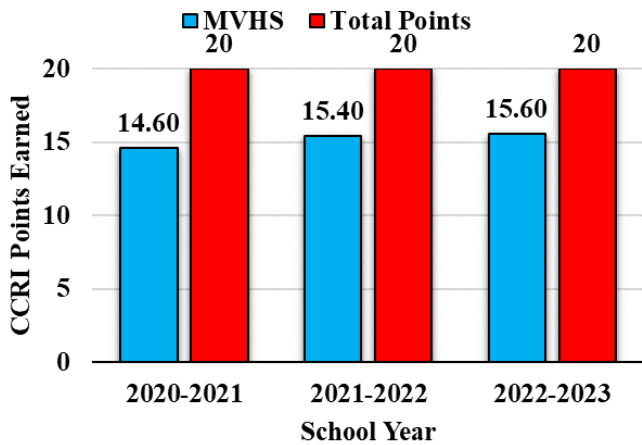
Graduation Rate (4 Year Cohort): Mountain View High School continues to maintain a graduation rate well above the state average.



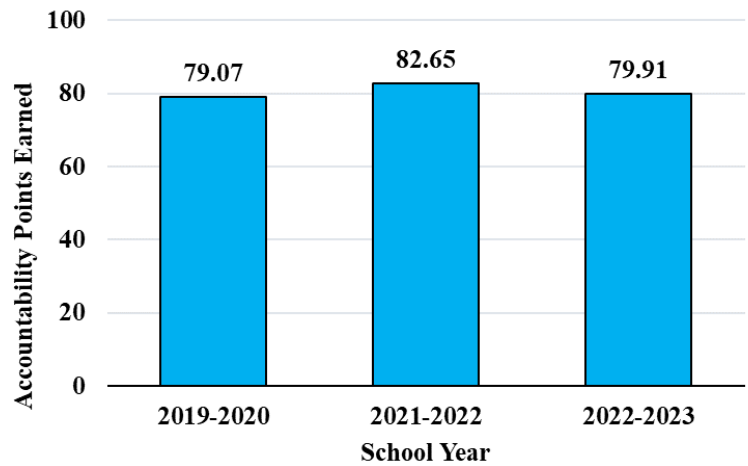
Drop Out Rate: Mountain View High School has consistently maintained a low drop out rate over the last three years

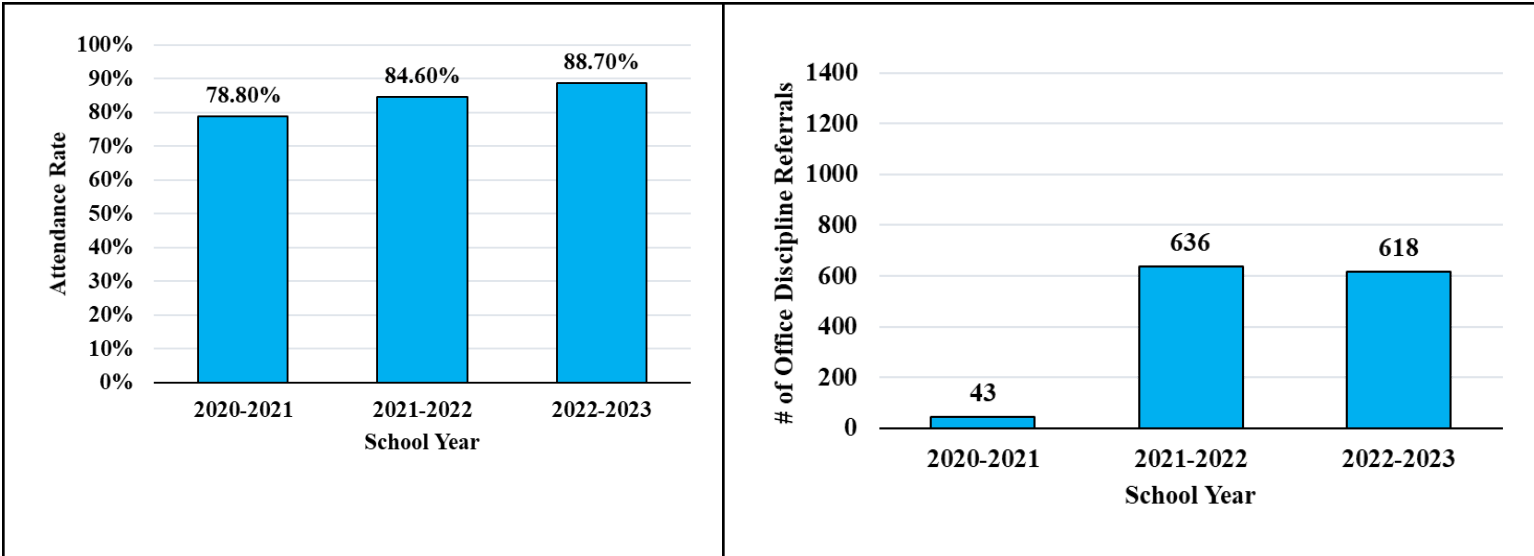

We are excited to announce that Mountain View High School is OFFICIALLY CERTIFIED in Level One of the High Reliability Schools Framework established by the Marzano Research Group. This year we are focused on Level Two: “Effective Teaching in Every Classroom”. We are excited to share action steps we are taking to make sure every student in our school experiences effective instruction every single day.

ACTION STEPS TO SUSTAIN LEVEL ONE

- Mountain View is committed to leveling up our implementation of our attendance and tardy policies and supports that results in a 5% increase in student attendance last year and a 75% reduction in students tardies.
- Mountain View continues to work closely with our students, teachers, Parent Resource Organization (PRO), booster groups, and community partnerships to provide opportunities for relevant and timely input to guide decisions at our school.
- Mountain View is committed to decreasing overall missing assignments by refining our grading policies, increasing parent and family communication, and clearly communicating student deadlines and expectations.

ACTION STEPS TOWARD LEVEL TWO CERTIFICATION

- With a commitment to effective teaching in every classroom, this year all teachers had dedicated professional learning time focused on the district wide “Gradual Release of Responsibility” instructional model.
- Each teacher has selected an individual growth goal for the 2023-2024 school year and professional learning is aligned to support their progress in this area.
- Teachers have the opportunity to observe and collaborate around effective teaching.
