On behalf of every member of Tortolita's dedicated, hardworking staff, I welcome you to Tortolita Middle School, where each child is valued and encouraged. Part of the Marana Unified School District, we are a 7-8 middle school offering the highest quality, inspiring, and enriching education in a safe, nurturing, and award-winning learning environment.

Home of the Cougars, our school provides a diverse educational experience for the 21st century by engaging students in comprehensive, relevant and rigorous instruction while incorporating student Chromebooks and collaborative, configurable furniture. We believe that children need many avenues for learning and those outside of the classroom are equally important. These are some significant aspects of our school culture:

- Academic Rigor: We offer honors-level classes in English, math, science and social studies and a challenging elective course for GEM (Gifted Education in Marana) students. 8th graders can earn high school credits in math and Spanish.
- Athletics: Our sports program is comprehensive and provides students the opportunity to participate in several sports each season. We organize as many teams as needed to accommodate all students who want to play any sport.
- **Technology:** Every student at our school receives a Chromebook and our teachers are trained to use these devices to enhance learning.

- Fine Arts: Our school offers art, band, ceramics, drama, guitar and orchestra. We also have advanced classes in art, ceramics and drama for 8th graders. Students have opportunities to perform on campus and in the community.
- Middle School Philosophy and Practices: The academic, behavioral, emotional and social needs of middle school students require us to ensure that our approaches and supports are tailored to meet those needs. Teachers are organized into interdisciplinary teams so that they can work collaboratively on behalf of the students they serve.

School Highlights- Points of Pride

- Tortolita was rated a "B" by the Department of Education
 - We have earned a "B" letter grade from the AZ State Board of Education. In four short years and despite Covid, Tortolita was able to raise our achievement scores every single year. Some highlights are below based on 2019 school year to the 2023:
 - Total points increased from 55 to 75 points overall
 - Points awarded by the state for student growth increased by 60%
- Our English Language Learner transformed percent growth is 84% compared to the state average of 54%
 - We are so proud of how hard our English Language Learners work at TMS!
- Last year 86% of our Cougar students earned a ticket to our EPIC celebration!
 - At Tortolita Middle School our motto is "Choose Excellence". Each year we challenge our students to work hard and do their best on all of their classwork, homework, and assessments. "Choose Excellence" and do their best to attend our EPIC celebration at the end of the school year!
- Tortolita has a competitive athletics program with 12 different sports to choose from: Boys tackle football, flag football, cross country, volleyball, soccer, wrestling, basketball, baseball, softball, and track and field.



<u>Tortolita Middle School Staff Profile</u>: We have 57 staff members who work at our school.












Standardized Testing Performance 8th Grade ELA:




Standardized Testing Performance 8th Grade Math:






<u>Civics Test Performance</u>: We had **265** 8th Grade students pass the Civics test and complete this high school graduation requirement while in middle school!




State of Arizona Letter Grade: Tortolita Middle School currently has a B letter grade from the Arizona Department of Education.




On Track Indicators
