I AM READY TO GO BACK TO SCHOOL WHEN I AM...

Fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication i.e. Tylenol, Motrin	Free from vomiting for at least 2 solid meals.	Free from diarrhea for at least 12 hours.	Treated with appropriate head lice treatment at home and proof is provided to the nurse.	Evaluated by a medical provider and have a note to return to school.	Free from fever. Evaluated by a medical provider if needed.

Parent Symptom Screening Tool
2022-2023 School Year

Recommended to complete daily prior to school and as needed for symptoms of illness.

Please use this screening tool to evaluate your child when they are ill before sending to school.

1. Has the student been in contact with anyone known to have or suspected to have COVID-19 in the last 14 days and having new symptoms following the exposure?
2. Is the student experiencing any of the following?

Group A 1 or more symptoms	Group B 2 or more symptoms
Fever (100.0 or higher)	Sore throat
New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline; example: worsening cough, cough not improved with inhaler medication, productive cough etc.)	Runny nose/congestion
Shortness of breath	Chills
Difficulty breathing	Fatigue
New lack of smell or taste	Muscle pain
	Nausea or Vomiting
	Headache
	Diarrhea

It is recommended that you keep the student at home and follow up with Primary Healthcare Provider if he or she*:

- Has one or more symptoms in Group A **OR**
- Has two or more symptoms in Group B **OR**
- Has been in close contact with a person known or suspected to have COVID-19 **within the past 14 days** and is having new symptoms following the exposure. “Close contact” is defined as being within 6 feet of a positive case of COVID-19 for a duration of 15 minutes or longer.

It is strongly recommended that **household** close contacts to COVID-19 wear a face covering for 10 days from the last exposure. **Masking of close contacts is recommended even if fully vaccinated or had COVID recently, and testing is recommended on/after day 5 following exposure.**
