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From the Health Room

**COVID Guidance for 23/24** 

COVID-19 will likely be with us as an ongoing endemic disease with emerging variants and seasonal fluctuations in cases. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment has shared **COVID-19 Reminders for Parents** to provide everyday steps to ensure everyone has access to healthy and safe learning spaces.

Here are BVSD guidelines:

If someone tests positive for COVID:

- They should stay home, isolating for a full five days after a positive test or the start of their symptoms
- They may return to school or work on Day 6, if symptoms are improving and they have been fever-free for 24 hours (without fever-reducing medications).
- After isolation, it recommended that individuals wear a mask for a full-five days.

# If someone is ill, but has not tested positive for COVID:

- They should stay home and follow the How Sick is Too Sick Guidelines.
  - Common symptoms of illness in children such as diarrhea, vomiting, and fever should be resolved for 24 hours (without medications) before a student or staff person returns to school.
  - Students may return to school or child care as long as their symptom(s)
    have been resolved for 24 hours unless the symptoms are caused by an
    illness that requires them to stay home longer and they are able to
    participate in school.

## Please remember:

- Regardless of COVID status stay home when sick
- Reach out to your health care provider to discuss testing and treatment options if you think you might have COVID-19 (e.g., you know you have been exposed to COVID-19, or know that COVID-19 is circulating in your community, school, or family and you have symptoms).
- If you think you may have COVID-19, avoid interacting with anyone who is more likely to develop severe disease. Though older adults have the highest risk for severe illness, some children may have medical conditions that increase their risk.

You can find more information on COVID-related illness and other common illnesses and guidelines for school attendance in CDPHE's **How Sick is Too Sick** and through your school's health team.

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If you have any plastic grocery bags that you would like to recycle, Elementary Art would be happy to take them. We will use them when we begin working with clay.

virtual reality headsets! Fifth graders have been working on video projects for their research projects.






