




Faculty & Staff Demographics

Elementary School



Elementary School at ICS is specifically designed to support whole child learning from students from K4 to Grade 5. These early years are critical in building a strong foundation in knowledge, skills, and character as a lifetime learner. The 2022/2023 school year at ICS Elementary saw notable growth with increased enrollment, the introduction of a values-based Bible curriculum, and enhanced learning tools. Students actively engaged in analytical thinking, writing, and discussions across subjects. Personalized digital learning tools were expanded, and Kindergarten students benefited from a new sensory wall. Dedicated teachers fostered a high-expectation, nurturing environment, organizing enriching experiences like field trips and successful sports achievements in international school tournaments. The year showcased events like the Elementary Science Fair and Interactive Digital Design Open House, emphasizing creativity and critical thinking.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Inaugural Science Fair for students from G3 to G5: The first Science Fair provided students with the opportunity to employ the scientific method to research ideas and present them to the wider community.
- Inquiry and Digital Design (IDD) Open Day: The inaugural IDD day allowed students to demonstrate their learning in coding and robotics to parents.
- Four Field Trips per grade level aligned to units of study: With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions, all grade levels visited various sites around the island, enhancing their classroom learning.
- Reading Appreciation Week: Activities during Reading Appreciation Week encouraged students to foster a love for reading through events like book character day, book reading sessions, book making, and a scavenger hunt.
- Spiritual Emphasis Week and Service Learning: The tradition of Spiritual Emphasis Week focused on the spiritual growth and well-being of each student. The theme, "It's Not About Me," inspired students to think of ways to serve others.







Academic Results




In 2023, 51 ICS students took 105 AP exams. Students take AP courses either at ICS or online through Northstar Academy.

Service Learning

ICS views service learning as an integral part of our school culture. This year, we rolled out our new service learning definition: The service learning program empowers students to be people of service beyond programs, but who instead live a lifestyle of service with joy and intention to benefit others. The ICS community wants to foster their ability to see that they can make a difference at any age level and in any location, serving and loving others just as Christ has served and loved us.



The service learning program:

- Provides the ICS community with opportunities to explore concepts of sacrifice, intentionality, humility, and varying methods of serving others so that as they grow, students will learn to look beyond themselves, see the needs of others, and be willing to help.
- Equips community members to discover the needs of those around them and identify ways they can sacrificially meet those needs through their time, talents, and abilities.

All throughout the year, our students from K4 through 12th grade, are learning about our Project 4:12 theme for the year, which was "It's Not About Me" through ES Little Knight Lights-led chapels and MS/HS Project 4:12 team meetings on Fridays. Our MS/HS students prepare throughout the year for their culminating project of Week Without Walls, which takes place in March, where this year they served with various local organizations, driving home the theme that when we serve others in humility and remember that our lives are not just about ourselves, we can be like Christ and help to make the world a better place for everyone.

Elementary School students' activities and involvement:

- · Sidekicks Unveiled": Our chapel sessions revolved around the theme of being "Sidekicks." Throughout the year, elementary students discovered their role as God's sidekicks, learning from biblical examples and applying these lessons to their own lives.
- · Project 4:12 Chapels "It's Not About Me": Focused on five key themes-selfish vs. selfless, convenience vs. sacrifice, eyes on others, selfish ambition vs. humility, and recognizing that we are more than sidekicks students delved deep into understanding the importance of these principles in their daily lives.
- · SEW Week "Jesus is Our Ultimate Super Hero": The culmination of our Spiritual Emphasis Week (SEW) echoed the themes explored in Project 4:12 Chapels. Each day, students delved into the qualities of Jesus, emphasizing selflessness, sacrifice, humility,



and the realization that, through Him, they become heroes in their own right.

- · Station Rotation during SEW: Students actively participated in SEW activities, rotating through stations such as games, art, music, technology, small group time, and worship, reinforcing the spiritual themes of the week.
- · Collaborative Service Project: The big service project for elementary students involved partnering with Project 4:12 buddies. Groups learned about different organizations, raised funds, and during SEW, worked collaboratively on art projects to raise awareness for their chosen causes.
- · Green Initiatives with Project Buddies: Fourth and fifth graders engaged in environmental stewardship during SEW, planting around the campus and along the fence with their buddies, contributing to the betterment of our school environment.
- · Reflection and Poster Creation: The year concluded with a reflective activity. Each student partnered with a peer to create posters depicting the qualities of a God's sidekick. These posters, showcasing the attributes of a good sidekick, now grace our hallways as a visual testament to a year of spiritual growth and community engagement.



Financials

As a non-profit charity school, ICS aims to provide high-quality education at an affordable price. At the core of what we do day in and day out is our vision to educate minds and transform lives through Biblical education. Sometimes, our focus on these priorities is so exceptional (as you can read throughout this report), it risks other important longterm metrics. This was the case in the 2022-23 school year, when expenses rose greater than revenue, continuing a trend of losses three years in a row. Whereas for-profit schools funnel profit to grow the wealth of its owners through dividends, ICS reinvests all of its net income ("profit") back into the school. Reinvesting positive net income immediately and directly builds up the community through enhanced student services, better facilities, and stronger incentives for quality faculty.

Although it was a tough year financially, we can thank God, our omnipotent provider, who has blessed us with healthy reserves from past years to allow ICS to weather these challenging times. We trust that He always knows what we need before we do, along with His expectation that we be good stewards of the resources granted to us. As we look to improve fiscal stewardship, ICS leadership is working with the school's board of directors, which is made up of ICS parents, on a plan to position ICS for longterm stability over the next 30 years. Rebuilding our reserves will directly benefit current ICS students and position the school for longterm growth in the dynamic and competitive Singapore environment.

Over the past 30 years, the uKnighted Fund has been a steady source of support, contributing an average of S\$1 million annually and impacting approximately 80 missionary families each year.
