Unfortunately, this week, a few middle school students chose to make excuses, blame others, or flat out lie to avoid the consequences of their actions. In the end, they not only faced more significant consequences, but they also lost my trust. It is my hope that when students misbehave, that they speak the truth when confronted, accept the consequences, and learn from their mistakes. If I were to make a small addition to President Garfield's, quote, it would read, "The truth will set you free, but first it will make you miserable, and lying will make you even more miserable!"
