


Academics 4th Grade

Our historians discovered the problems facing Texas as a new republic, and how agriculture, enterprise and immigration played a major role in Texas' development as a nation.






5th Grade

Students have enjoyed reading information texts about "Exploring the Wild West". The students have also become pioneers and begun writing an argumentative essay explaining whether their groups would rather live in the peaceful settlement of Harmony Hills or the bustling boomtown of Boot Hill. Students have been discussing Westward Expansion and are leading into discussions about the Civil War. Students in Science have enjoyed learning about the water cycle and creating exciting presentations. We set up a mini Science Fair and enjoyed having other students walk through visiting the presentations. Visitors got a chance to "quiz" the students on their projects by selecting a random question and asking the 5th Grade Scientists as they visited. In Math, students are earning about representations of data by creating input/output tables based on a rule expressed as an equation. We are then creating ordered pairs to graph on a coordinate grid.

6th grade readers and writers are currently reading the novel A Long Walk to Water. It's a very interesting novel based on a real person's life. They are utilizing their skills and strategies throughout the novel.

This month in Social Studies we are studying Southeast and East Asia. While studying the culture of this area we learned about how the Asian culture has diffused to other areas.
