The Senior School has a rigorous college preparatory curriculum, where education is viewed as building the skills and habits of inquiry, research, creativity, critical thinking, and problem solving.

SSA maintains rigorous standards of grading and awards letter grades as follows:

TYPICAL COURSE PROGRESSION

COURSE NUMBERING

Because SSA offers so few designated advanced courses, we use an internal numbering system on our transcripts. The course numbering system indicates curricular sequence as follows:

- 100 level – Grade 9 or introductory
- 200 level – Grade 10
- 300 level – Grade 11
- 400 level – Grade 12
- 500 level – AP or highest level offered

ADVANCED PLACEMENT & HONORS COURSES

SSA does not designate any courses as “honors” because all courses follow a rigorous college preparatory curriculum.

Advanced Placement courses are only offered in **three** subject areas: math, foreign language, and computer science. Therefore, **most SSA students do not take more than two AP courses during their time at SSA.**
