**Humanities** courses are those from the fields of History, Literature, Language, and the Visual and Performing Arts which contribute to the development of skills that students require to better participate in and understand the processing and documenting of the human experience which provides students with an opportunity to develop a sense of connection to those who have come before us as well as to their contemporaries. Such skills include: oral and written communication, rational analysis, creative and critical thinking, emotional insight & imagination.

**STEM** courses are those from the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and/or Mathematics which contribute to the development of skills that students require to design solutions to complex problems. Such skills include: asking questions, planning and carrying out investigations, analyzing and interpreting data, using mathematics and computational thinking, constructing explanations, engaging in argument from evidence & obtaining, evaluating and communicating information.
