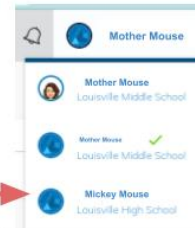

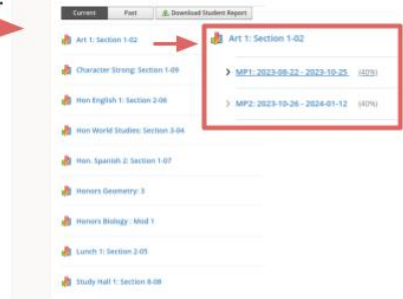
The school newsletter will be mailed at the end of each grading period from now on, because we are transitioning to a quarterly mailing to be sent home. Please continue to monitor your email, school website and school social media for the most up to date information. This quarter, we are sending home updated instructions for you to use to find your child's grades. Report Cards for the first semester will be uploaded to the accounts January 19th.

How to Check Your Child's Daily Grades in Schoology

1. [Log into Schoology.](#)
 - a. Option #1: Have your child log into their Schoology account on the Chromebook.
 - b. Option #2: Log into your own parent account on a device. Then, select your student from the drop down.



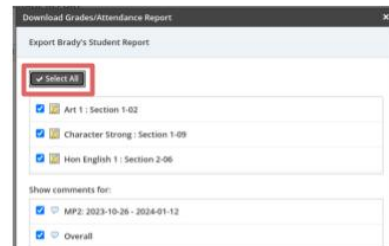
2. Select 'GRADE REPORT' from the gray header.
3. Click each course to see grades. You will see each marking period as a dropdown.
4. Use Schoology codes and/or teacher-entered comments to help navigate.



1. To download a report card in Schoology, click on "Download Student Report".



2. Click the marking period. Then, click 'Next'.
 - MP1: 2023-08-22 - 2023-10-25 Aug 22, 2023 to Oct 25, 2023
 - MP2: 2023-10-26 - 2024-01-12 Oct 26, 2023 to Jan 12, 2024



3. Finally, select 'Select All'. Then, hit 'Submit'.

How to Print an End of Nine-Weeks Report Card via Home Access Center (HAC)

1. Go to <https://www.louisvillecityschools.org/>.
2. Click on 'Families' **OR** hover and select 'Middle School Families'.
3. Then, select the 'Home Access Center' button.
4. Select 'Louisville City' from the 'Select a District' drop down menu.
5. Enter the student's Username and 'Password'. Then, click the 'Sign In' button.
6. To print a report card, click on the 'Grades' button at the top of the screen.
7. You will see a list of grades through the current marking period.
8. To print a report card, click the 'Print' button on the right side of the window.

Report Card Grades can be viewed through the Home Access Center by logging in with the credentials of your student. Daily Grades can be viewed by signing up as a parent in Schoology and associating your account with your student.

Schoology grades are synced with HAC each nine-weeks and should match in letter. In most cases, HAC rounds up the percentage from Schoology when synced.

College Credit Plus

This is a reminder to all parents and students who plan on taking College Credit Plus classes either on our Campus or on a College Campus next school year. The annual presentation is posted online with the intent form. No student will be permitted to take a college credit plus class without viewing the presentation, and signing the intent form online. Signing the intent form your slip in does NOT mean that you have to take CC+ classes but does allow you to sign up for them if you would like. Be sure to adhere to all of the deadlines.

School Delays and Closings

School will either be delayed or closed on days when weather and driving/road conditions are hazardous and dangerous for students and staff. The forecasting and predicting of hazardous weather in Ohio is always challenging, and the decision to cancel or delay school must be made very early in the morning. **Delays and closings will almost always be announced by 6:30 AM. If there is no announcement to cancel or delay school by 6:30 AM, you may safely assume that school will be in session.**

Parents will be notified by the Telephone Notification System in the event school is delayed or cancelled. The phone call and parent notification may take several minutes to reach your home if there are a number of area school delays or closings.

If school is delayed, Louisville Schools will only delay the opening of school for two hours. Rarely, if ever, will school be delayed and then cancelled. All bus runs and school starting times will simply be delayed by two hours. There will be **no AM pre-school** when school is delayed for two hours, and no breakfast will be served in any of the school cafeterias.

A **two-hour delay** simply means that school will be delayed by two hours in the morning. Students should report to school or to their bus stop two hours later than their normal times. Buses will "pick-up" students two hours later than the normal pick-up times. School buildings will operate on an adjusted schedule, and students will be dismissed from school at their regular times and at their regular bus return trip times.

2024-2025 Scheduling

The school counselors will meet with students to prepare for next school year this quarter. State Testing Incentive

If students fulfill all of the criteria listed below, they will have Friday, May 10 off of school; this is part of our incentive for our Ohio State Test (OST) days.

1. Must be in attendance at school on **ALL** testing days. Excuses will be approved by principals only. **Please avoid scheduling appointments on these testing days.**
2. Must eat breakfast at school or home on the day of testing.
3. Must come prepared with appropriate materials for testing
4. Must use paper to work out math problems and organize writing.
5. Must work the minimum time on the test. Teachers will share minimum work times with the students.
6. Must maintain appropriate behavior during testing sessions.
