ENERGIZED LADY CAVS JOLT MCNAIRY 74-48; BOBCATS SILENCE CROCKETT BOYS

For about seven minutes Friday night, it looked like perhaps the satisfaction of the previous evening's defeat of then 19-0 Gibson County was wearing on Crockett County's Lady Cavaliers.

The shots just weren't falling for Coach Kayla Irvin's squad, and a few turnovers reared their ugly heads as well. With 1:21 remaining in the opening quarter against McNairy Central, the visiting Lady Bobcats had a 16-9 lead and every intention of sustaining it.

But if you've seen this edition of the Lady Cavs, you know that even if the shots aren't falling, this Crockett bunch is going to scrap and claw and hustle until eventually – it rights the ship. And a second before the first-period buzzer sounded, reserve Halle Holyfield stuck back a rebound basket to trim the margin to 18-15.

That seemed to ignite the Lady Cavs just a little bit more, and when senior Jayden Maddox converted a three-point play the old-fashioned way at 7:43 of Quarter #2, suddenly Crockett was ahead 20-18. After trading buckets for a while, Hannah Johnson nailed a jumper with 1:51 left before the break for a 30-29 Crockett edge. The hosts never looked back after that.

Sarah Cherry nailed a "Cherry Bomb" three from the top of the key just before the halftime horn and Crockett carried a 35-29 advantage into the dressing room, not to mention virtually all of the game's momentum. The energy just blossomed from that point on.

And in the final two quarters, Irvin's club blitzed McNairy 39-19 to capture a 74-48 victory, the Lady Cavs' 13th in 17 starts this season.

Johnson, a hurricane of activity in this one, led all scorers with 20 points and repeatedly drew "oohs" and "aahs" from the large crowd with speedy steals, acquisition of loose balls, pass interceptions, and deft assists to her teammates. She had plenty of offensive help, as Charity Greenhill nailed a careerhigh 15 points and Cherry added 14 as Crockett turned the contest into a rout.

Most of the damage was done in a 23-10 third stanza in which Johnson poured in 11 points, Greenhill drilled her third trey of the night, and Crockett's pressing defense seemed to be everywhere as the Lady Bobcats simply couldn't adjust.

Amaria Walker and Jordyn Maddox each contributed six points to the Crockett cause as the team now prepares to begin district play Tuesday night, hosting South Gibson in a 6:00 doubleheader.

Friday's nightcap featured another lopsided loss for the Cavalier boys, falling to McNairy 43-26 in a game which featured one of the slowest starts in basketball history. With more than four and a half minutes played in the opening quarter, the Bobcats led 2-0. Crockett finally got on the board at the 2:53 mark on a Dre Walker bucket and then actually took the lead when Antuan Hobson made it 4-2 some 31 seconds later.

But that's all the points Crockett would score in the initial stanza, and the second period didn't see much improvement as the hosts went into the locker room trailing 16-9. That's not a typo – that was the actual halftime score.

McNairy won the third quarter 13-11, but the Cavs' offense was so anemic it didn't really feel like the game was still within reach. And when McNairy won the final period 14-6, Crockett's boys fell to 2-15 on the season.

Walker finished with five points and was Crockett's leading scorer, which summarizes the inefficiency. Kevin Pledge and Hobson were next in line with four apiece. McNairy's Darrien Clark led everybody with 16.
