LAST FIRST DAY

August 25th, 2022 was my youngest child's last first day of school in Olmsted Falls. She held the obligatory "first day of school" sign and as we took her picture I was hit with a wave of emotion when I saw the number "12" in the "grade" space. I probably should have seen this coming. This was her last first day and I wasn't ready for it.

Maybe I wasn't ready because much of her high school experience took place during the pandemic. The traditional path from Freshman to Senior was anything but traditional. It wasn't easy- academically, socially, emotionally- and it often felt like she and her classmates deserved a "do-over" for all of the missed milestones. But that is not how it works when it comes to our kids growing up, is it? The three years of High School (and the nine years of school before that) flew by whether I liked it or not.



Her class was the first to have Kindergarten, which was ½ day back then, at the Early Childhood Center. AM Kindergarten was tough, as she was not a "morning person." Man, that bus came early! There were many cranky afternoons that year. For me. She was also cranky at times. I bought a book about how to deal with tantrums. She threw a tantrum about me buying the tantrum book. I never finished it.

At Falls-Lenox, her teachers saw her strengths and were patient with her often extremely messy workspace and excessive Kleenex use. One highlight was her turn as Jim Henson, creator of the Muppets, at the third grade wax museum. She wore a 70's wig, beard, and sideburns and looked more like Zach Galifianakis. She loved the 8th Grade Washington D.C. trip...until it ended with an unpleasant mystery illness that spread quickly through her and her classmates. The memory of that bus ride has gotten easier for her with time;) There were ups and downs, but mostly ups. Her teachers made sure she was always ready for what was next.

Today, we are visiting colleges and looking to the future. She's still not a morning person and she might not be the tidiest, but she makes it work. She doesn't know what she wants to be when she grows up, but she discovered a love and a gift for art (thanks to INCREDIBLE OF teachers) and she is looking forward to the May Art Show when she will present her senior portfolio to the world (or at least the greater Olmsted area!) Will she turn that early interest in Muppet-making into a career? Time will tell!

Whether this was your child's first first day of school, their last, or somewhere in between, I hope you'll embrace what's ahead. Struggles will come but you're not alone. Talk to the teachers. Get to know the principal. Tell them about your child so that they can help bring out the best in them. I've got less than nine months to get used to the idea that this phase of raising my kids is coming to an end. There are many more "lasts" ahead for my daughter...but so many "firsts" still to come. APPLE VOLCANO EXPERIMENT

YOU WILL NEED:

-Baking Soda -Vinegar -Container to catch fizz -Apples -Knife for adults to carve out a hole

HOW TO SET UP AN APPLE VOLCANO

STEP 1. Put your apple on a dish, pie plate, or tray to catch the runoff. An adult should use a knife to cut a hole or vessel in the top of the apple about halfway down.

STEP 2. Kids can put a couple of spoons of baking soda into the hole. Hint: Add a drop of dish soap if you want a foamier eruption! The chemical eruption will produce more bubbles with the added dish soap and create more runoff.

STEP 3. Add a few drops of food coloring if you want. Mix it up and pair different colors with different apples.

STEP 4. Pour the vinegar into an easy to use cup for the kids. Pouring straight from a cup into the apple will produce a more dramatic volcano effect.

STEP 5. Eat your leftover (plain!) apples and enjoy the show!



APPLE VOLCANO

BAKING SODA AND VINEGAR REACTION

A chemical reaction occurs between two or more substances that change and form a new substance. Here, you have a liquid acid, vinegar, and a base solid, baking soda.
