STEPS TO APPLY for Student Enrollment for 2024-2025

Who can apply to be a student at New Heights Charter School?

All students eligible to enter Transitional Kindergarten - Eighth grades in the 2024-25 school year can apply to New Heights Charter School.

What is the process to apply for enrollment for my child into New Heights Charter School?

1. Sign-up to complete lottery application online <https://newheights.schoolmint.net/> or call the school to complete the Lottery Application over the phone. You can also drop-off the completed application at Lower Campus: 2202 Martin Luther King, Jr., LA 90008, on or before February 16th, 2024 at 3:00 p.m.

When will I know if there is space for my child in the school?

You will receive notification 2 weeks after the deadline for applications.

What is the lottery? And why is a lottery held?

A lottery is held when there are more applications than spaces available. The Lottery for the 2024-2025 school year will be held **February 23rd, 2024 at 2:00pm on Upper Campus.**

New Heights Charter School does not charge tuition, and is not sectarian in admission policies, programs and all other operations. New Heights shall not require a parent/legal guardian/student to provide information regarding a student's disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, legal or economic status, primary language or English Learner status, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic that is contained in the definition of hate crimes set forth in section 422.55 of the Penal Code, including immigration status, or any other information that would violate federal or state law, prior to admission, participation in any admissions or attendance lottery, or pre-enrollment event or process, or as a condition of admission or enrollment. New Heights Charter School may request, at the time of, and as part of, conducting its lottery process, the provision of information necessary to apply specific admissions preferences set forth in its Charter.
