




During the Discover portion of the journey, students begin to discover their strengths, talents and interests as they sample a variety of topics, have new experiences and explore available resources.



Advanced Core Classes

Advanced Courses are designed for students who exhibit talents in core subjects. Advanced courses are available to students who either participated in Mosaic or who meet entrance criteria.



Advanced Core Classes - 6th Grade



Advanced Writing

The Advanced Writing class approaches the 6th grade standards with:

- greater depth
- an increased focus on sentence structure, punctuation use, and writing organization.
- a focus on students' voice and choice and creativity
- guided practice and conferencing

Advanced Science

In the Advanced Science 6 course, students will:

- engage in experiences that prioritizes depth and complexity
- include deep conversations, extensions, projects, and presentations
- emphasize research and in-depth annotations of text
- enhance their scientific critical thinking and communication.

Advanced Core Classes - 6th Grade



Advanced Social Studies

In the Advanced Social Studies 6 course, students will:

- engage in experiences that prioritizes depth and complexity
- include deep conversations, extensions projects, and presentations
- emphasize research and in-depth annotations of text
- enhance their historical critical thinking and communication skills.

Advanced Reading

In the Advanced Reading 6 course, students will:

- reach common educational goals through personal exploration, development and research
- read inside and outside of the classroom
- develop strong vocabulary, understanding of the mechanics of genres and a comprehensive meaning of the written word



- Mosaic students are eligible for Advanced courses of their choice
- Not available in Spanish Language
- Entrance criteria varies by subject

Criteria for Advanced Science at CMS

Science

95%ile on aReading AND aMath

95%ile on aReading with strong score in aMath

95%ile on aMath with strong score in aReading

- -5th grade teacher rating scale on Science with an "Exceeds" score on Science MCA
- -6th and 7th grade teacher rating scale on Science with strong aReading and aMath scores

Next Steps for Advanced Core Classes

- Mosaic students will be placed in the core courses requested
- Interested 5th graders in Eden Prairie Schools will complete a writing sample at the end of February
- Additional testing will occur in April and May (FastBridge and MCAs)





Writing Samples:

In-district 5th graders who indicate interest in Advanced Reading/Writing and/or Social Studies will be completing a writing sample during the week of Feb. 24th.

 There will be 2 options for students to choose from for their writing sample, and they can handwrite or type their work.
 Students will have about 45 minutes to complete their sample.

<u>Here is the Rubric</u> that will be used for scoring students' writing samples.

Students will NOT be receiving feedback or scores on their work. Families will be informed of their students' course placement in June.



- Students who are new to Eden Prairie Schools but enrolled by **April 30th**, will complete a writing sample in <u>May</u> and take FastBridge tests in <u>May</u>, if needed.
- Students who enroll after April 30th will be placed in Core classes. After the FastBridge testing in the Fall, eligible students will complete a writing sample and/or take the math placement tests.

KeyScholars Social Studies





KeyScholars Social Studies 6



This course follows the same curriculum as Social Studies 6, and has been adapted for the unique needs of gifted learners. It includes numerous enrichment opportunities throughout the year.

Current KeyScholars 5th graders will be **automatically** registered for this course.

To indicate interest in the advanced course **select** "Request Advanced Social Studies."

Any student who meets the criteria for Advanced Social Studies 6 will be placed in the Advanced course instead.







Math Course Options



Accelerated Math

There are two options for math in 6th grade.

- Students in Eden Prairie Schools are placed with grade-level peers for math.
- Some students benefit from <u>accelerating to the next grade</u> <u>level in math</u>. These students are placed in a course one year ahead of the typical grade level progression (6th graders take 7th grade math, etc.)

There is not an "advanced" math class at CMS.



Grade Level: Math 6

Accelerated Level: Accelerated Honors PreAlgebra 6

-or- Telescope Math 6

For students who have completed 5th grade Mosaic math or meet eligibility.

5th graders in Eden Prairie Schools will take district math assessments in <u>April and May</u> to determine appropriate course placement. More information will be shared later this spring.



Accelerated Honors PreAlgebra 6 and Telescope Math 6/Skipping a Year

Passing score on Procedural Math Placement Test Passing score on Conceptual Math Placement Test 98%ile on FastBridge aMath, consistently

6th Grade Telescope Math

Telescope Math 6 blends math concepts from Math 6 and PreAlgebra 7 into one year. Students who successfully complete this course are placed in Accelerated Honors Algebra in 7th grade.

 Eligible students who were not in Mosaic are generally placed in Telescope Math 6 since they have not had instruction in 6th grade content.

The same placement process will determine eligibility for both Accelerated Honors PreAlgebra and Telescope Math.

Next Steps for Accelerated Math Classes

- Students in Mosaic will be placed in Accelerated Honors PreAlgebra 6.
- All other 5th grade students in Eden Prairie Schools will take the Procedural Math Placement test during the week of April 7th.
- Students with <u>qualifying FastBridge aMath</u> scores AND a <u>passing</u> score on the <u>Procedural Math Placement test</u> will take the Conceptual Math Placement test at the end of May.

This placement process is the only path for students to be placed in Accelerated/Telescope Math.

Not a current Eden Prairie Student?

- Students who are new to Eden Prairie Schools and are enrolled by April 30th will take the Math Placement tests in May. If any additional achievement testing is necessary, it will take place in May.
- Students who enroll after April 30th will be placed in Core classes. After FastBridge testing in the Fall, eligible students can take the math placement test.

To move into a more advanced Spanish course, students can request the higher-level course during registration. They will then be tested for that placement in the spring.

Enriched Spanish Social Studies 7

8th grade:

Enriched Spanish Social Studies 8

*Recommend that Spanish Immersion students take as many courses taught in Spanish as possible.

Final Notes



Advanced/ Honors Course Requirements

Once a student is placed in an Advanced or Honors course, it is expected that they maintain a course grade of at least a B AND a Summative Assessment average of at least a C+.

Students who do not meet these requirements can be moved out of the Advanced/Honors course, or may need to retake the Accelerated math course.



Specialized Timelines: What You Can Expect

- February 7-21: Registration window open
- **February/March:** CMS lead and 5th grade special education teachers meet to review/revise course requests
- Ongoing: IEP meetings, school visits
- **Spring/Summer:** Master scheduling work continues; review special education course requests and work through conflicts

Specialized Timelines: What You Can Expect

- Mid-August: Schedules and IEP manager assignments finalized; orientation occurs
- August 25-29: Workshop week; Special education teachers reach out to families

Identifying Multilingual Students

Students who speak a language other than English take an English proficiency test.

Services are provided based on individual qualifications.











English Language Learners take an English language proficiency test (ACCESS) every year to monitor and report progress towards English language proficiency.

Test scores are used to decide what English language support services to provide.

Teachers use test scores as they decide what and how to teach their students.



ACCESS Testing

Students use listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills to learn academic content, share information, and discuss ideas.

These are skills that all students work on throughout their education.

Language testing measures a student's skills in all four of these areas.



How do students "exit"?

If a student has an **overall composite score of at least 4.5** and three out of four domain scores (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) of at least 3.5, that student has met the ACCESS proficiency score.
