

November Freshman Group Guidance--4 Year Plan

- Input your freshman year courses (including summer school courses if applicable.) Check off these courses on your "Graduation Requirement" sheet. (If you earned 8th grade credit; check off these requirements as well.) *NOTE—LT graduation requirements differ from 4-year college requirements.*
- Complete the next 3 years by adding up to 7 full courses each year. It is OK to be general and call a course "practical art, "social studies elective," "creative art," "elective," etc. Your goal is to have tentative plan where classes will fit—you do not need to name the specific classes at this time.
- Make sure all of your LT graduation requirements have been checked off. Also make sure that additional post-secondary requirements have been met.

***Once you have completed the above directions; you can explore the online or hard copy of the Academic Program Guide (APG) to learn course details and change your general courses to more specific ideas.

***This is just an exercise to get you to think about what you want to take, need to take, and when you have time to take it. Please access your counselor for any assistance or specific questions.
