Materials and Curriculum

Intervention teachers use a variety of research-based materials and strategies. Our primary resource is i-Ready instruction with supplementary materials being used as needed. I-Ready instruction offers students personalized lessons that are specifically designed to address their individual needs.

The program is adaptive to student growth and progress. Instructional strategies include a blended learning format. This format features a rotation among online instruction, teacherled small groups, and independent learning.

Student Growth

Kyrene's intervention program uses i-Ready software to identify and diagnose the areas where students need additional assistance. Diagnostic testing is provided at the beginning, middle, and end-of-year to ensure individual learning needs are met. Additionally, students are assessed periodically so that teachers can monitor progress and adjust instruction as needed. Student success in intervention is largely based on everyone's willingness to work together to improve performance.

Studies have shown that students using i-Ready Instruction for 45 or more minutes per subject per week for at least 25 weeks showed significantly greater gains than the average student.
