

AAA and ExCEL Awards:

Congratulations to PLHS 12th graders, Isabelle Ohlmann and Finn Pauna, who are Prior Lake High School's AAA (Academics, Arts, and Athletics) Award nominations for 2023–24! Presented by MSHSL, the AAA Award honors 12th graders who demonstrate exceptional achievements in academics, fine arts, and athletics. Isabelle participates in band, speech and soccer, while Finn participates in band, golf and visual arts.

In addition to their accomplishments in activities and arts, AAA Award winners must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. The top award recipients from each region will be invited to a recognition luncheon and one senior boy and one senior girl from both Class A and Class AA will be selected to win \$1,000 scholarships.

Congratulations to PLHS juniors Levi Eiter and Delaney Dahl, who were nominated as this year's ExCEL Award (Excellence in Community, Education and Leadership) recipients! Sponsored by the Minnesota State High School League (MSHSL), this unique recognition program is designed exclusively for Minnesota high school juniors who are active in school activities, who show leadership qualities, and who work voluntarily in their community.

Levi and Delaney will now be considered for the state ExCEL Award. State ExCEL Award recipients will be selected by an independent panel of judges from schools throughout Minnesota, and winners will be announced on February 6.

PLHS Health Office Update:

As we continue to navigate cold and flu season, the Health Office wants to share some important reminders to help keep our students <u>and</u> staff healthy and in school. Your partnership in promoting a healthy environment is crucial, and here are some key points to keep in mind:

Hand Hygiene Practices: Reinforce the importance of regular handwashing with your student. Encourage them to wash their hands thoroughly with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after coughing or sneezing.

Respiratory Etiquette: Teach your student the importance of covering their mouth and nose with a tissue or elbow when coughing or sneezing. This simple practice helps prevent the spread of respiratory droplets that may carry viruses.

Stay Home When Sick: If your student is feeling unwell or experiencing flu-like symptoms such as fever (100.0 and above), uncontrolled cough, or body aches, please keep them at home. This not only supports their recovery but also helps prevent the spread of illness within our school community.

Cleaning and Disinfecting: Our custodial staff diligently cleans and disinfects high-touch surfaces throughout the school to minimize the risk of infection.

Your cooperation and vigilance during cold and flu season are greatly appreciated. Together, we can create a healthy and safe learning environment for all of our staff and students. 
