





Honors/Advanced Placement Course Student Agreement for 2024-2025 *copy in Spanish available on our school website <u>https://chs.gilroyunified.org/student-</u> services

Christopher High School supports any student who wants to accept the challenges of an advanced level class. However, the opportunity to take an Honors or Advanced Placement (AP) course carries with it the assumption that the students taking these courses possess the maturity, commitment, and academic capabilities to do honors or college level work. Honors and AP courses are meant to be a challenging learning experience that will prepare students for college success. Typically, successful Honors/AP students are task-oriented, proficient readers with a true desire to learn and who are able to time manage in order to keep up with the fast pace of the curriculum. Students and parents must understand that Honors and AP courses are more rigorous and require much more time than that of a regular college prep course. Please note that EACH AP test will cost approximately \$94 (per AP class taken) and must be paid for by NOVEMBER of 2024.


**AP Students: You must take the AP exam in order to receive the extra grade point "bump" in an AP class. In addition, a grade of a " D" or" F" in the class will not receive a grade point bump. It is recommended that a student take no more than 3/Honors AP courses in a year.

This course agreement must be submitted before March 1, 2024 .

Staffing decisions have been made based on the number of students who have registered for each Honors/AP course. Students will not be dropped from an Honors/AP class after registration. Please consider this decision seriously.

Students must complete this form in order to enroll in Honors courses. This is part of the registration form.




