POLICY

1. CATEGORIES OF USERS

- a. Students

2. TECHNOLOGY AS RELATED TO CURRICULUM

3. DESCRIPTION AND EXAMPLES OF ACCEPTABLE USE

- a. E-mail among students and staff within the school and other locations.
- b. Accessing remote sources of information for academic purposes.
- c. Sending and receiving electronic files for academic purposes.
- d. Uploading information to share with other individuals for academic purposes.
- e. Announcements of school events (excluding non-approved events and commercial ventures) with approval from school administration.

4. AGREEMENT FORM TO BE SIGNED BY PARENTS AND STUDENTS/USERS

- a. Students who have not returned an Acceptable Use Policy permission form signed by the student and his/her parent or legal guardian will not have independent use of the computers, networks, or Internet and will not have school-provided e-mail services.
- b. Students agree to the terms of the Hayes Middle School Acceptable Use Policy.

5. 1:1 DEVICE/CHROMEBOOK USAGE AND RESPONSIBILITY

- a. Students who have not returned a 1:1 Chromebook Pledge form signed by the student and his/her parent or legal guardian will not have a chromebook assigned to them for individual use.
- b. Students agree to the terms of the 1:1 Chromebook Pledge.
- c. Damaged or lost Chromebooks resulting from negligent or intentional behavior will be the financial responsibility of the student. (Pricing based on the district provided parts list)
- d. Students will not be issued a replacement chromebook until their repair balance is paid.
