 - Have your parent reach out to your current 8th grade teacher for that subject area to discuss the recommendation. You can then attach a note to your course selection sheet stating parent has contacted the teacher and indicate which level of the course you should be scheduled for.
- What if I do not want to double up on science?
 - Cross out the recommendation for Chemistry (make sure you select 8 total credits).
- What if I do not want to take Spanish II but it has been recommended?
 - Cross out the recommendation for Spanish II. Note that you will have to take Spanish II later or pursue a completer program.

PREREQUISITE - A COURSE THAT YOU MUST TAKE PRIOR TO TAKING ANOTHER COURSE. FOR EXAMPLE YOU MUST PASS ALGEBRA 1 BEFORE YOU TAKE GEOMETRY

GPA- THE AVERAGE OF FINAL GRADES RECEIVED FOR EVERY COURSE TAKEN BY A STUDENT IN HIGH SCHOOL.
