Science Education

Less:

- Rote memorization of facts & terms
- Teachers providing information to the whole class
- Students reading textbooks and answering questions at the end of a chapter
- Worksheets
- Pre-planned outcome for "cookbook" laboratories or hands-on activities

More:

- Facts and terminology learned as needed while developing explanations and designing solutions supported by evidence-based arguments and reasoning
- Students conducting investigations, solving problems, and engaging in discussions with teachers' guidance
- Students reading multiple sources and developing summaries of information
- Students writing journals, reports, posters, and media presentations that explain and argue
- Multiple investigations driven by students' questions with a range of possible outcomes that collectively lead to deep understanding of established core scientific ideas

Math Lab

- Math Lab is a support hour that takes place of an elective
- Student Knowledge gaps will be addressed through current content using a variety of different learning techniques
- Students are recommended for this class from their elementary school teachers

College Prep Math

- Students in this course will be learning content from the 6th grade Common Core State Standards
- Students will master content using Big Ideas Math textbook (green version)
- Students are engaged in activities in their Record and Practice Journals

Advance Math

- Students in this course will be learning content from the 7th grade Common Core State Standards using Big Ideas Math (Red version)
- The content covered will be more rigorous and at a rapid pace than college prep
- Students will deepen their mathematical thinking and learn to explain math concepts using correct math discourse
