III. REGULAR SESSION ~ 6:30 P.M.

A. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Irvin convened this Board meeting of the Tigard-Tualatin School District Board of Directors to order at 6:30 PM at the Tigard-Tualatin Training Center, at 9550 SW Murdock St., Tigard, OR 97224. She shared that the Board had met in a Work Session regarding the Continuous Improvement Plans 2023-24. IV. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA & CONSENT AGENDA ~ 6:31 PM (0:30 Timestamp)

Chair Irvin asked Superintendent Rieke-Smith if there are any changes to the agenda. Superintendent Rieke-Smith shared that Action Item XI.C. Summer 2024 Boiler Replacement Project agenda item will be removed from the agenda, and brought forward at a later date and Chair Irvin added a new Action item XI.D. Statement of Support for TTSD Superintendent Susan Rieke-Smith, Ed, D. and she noted that there are no other changes to the agenda. Chair Irvin asked for a MOTION to approve the Agenda and Consent Agenda consisting of the December 11, 2023 TTSD Board Work Session Minutes, and the Human Resources/Personnel Report, as amended. Vice Chair Jaimes made a MOTION to approve the Agenda and Consent Agenda, as amended. Director Jill Zurschmeide seconded the MOTION. Chair Irvin asked for discussion. There was no discussion. The MOTION carried unanimously, 4-0. The MOTION passed.

VII. SUPERINTENDENT & BOARD COMMUNICATION ~ 6:48 PM (14:08 Timestamp)

- Chair Irvin shared the following comments:
 - Affirm what Director Zurschmeide said regarding support for Superintendent Rieke-Smith. She will address those comments during the added Action Item D – Statement of Support for TTSD Superintendent Susan Rieke-Smith, Ed, D.
 - Attended Winter Fest at Durham ES. There were 600+ kids and adults in the cafeteria, and for 45-minutes students were singing winter songs, and for those 45 minutes there were no behavior/discipline issues.
 - She shared that there was a comment from our last board meeting regarding elementary and middle school behavior concerns, and could TTSD start a Creekside type ES/MS for these younger students? Chair Irvin provided clarification regarding this suggestion.

VIII. PUBLIC COMMENT ~ 6:58 PM (29:20 Timestamp)

Chair Irvin shared that the Tigard-Tualatin School Board meetings are public meetings where the business of the Board is conducted in an open meeting for the public to observe as required by law, however regular public comment at board meetings is a policy choice of the Board and is not a legal requirement. As the Board values the input from our students, parents and district community members that we serve. The Board provides these opportunities for community members to provide input on important topics. In addition to public comment, community members may submit written comments to the Board secretary, Patty Roberts, at each meeting or email comments directly to the Board. Public comments are limited to three (3) minutes for each comment and should be brief and concise. Speakers may offer objective criticism of school operations and programs. The Board will not hear complaints concerning specific personnel.

IX. REPORTS AND DISCUSSION ITEMS ~ Time: 7:11 PM (41:34 Timestamp)

- A. Board of Director's Reports on CIP Presentations – Presenter: Chair Irvin ~ Time: 7:11 PM (41:34 Timestamp)

Vice Chair Jaimes – Metzger ES – Jessica Swindle – Metzger has a dual immersion program school, have approximately 585 students, and one important thing that they have is “Morning Circle Time” which creates a soft start that makes a welcoming start of the school day. They also are doing a lot of lessons in terms of intent vs impact. Metzger is also teaching students about their cultures and how to be respectful. In terms of academic achievement they are doing really great to shorten the achievement gap, and by hosting the dual immersion program in the school, they are able to decrease that gap. They are also looking at oracy, as it is a focus of the district, to be able to shorten or decrease that gap.

Director Zurschmeide – Tigard HS – Melissa Baran, and this is her first year as principal at Tigard High, and she has a new vision and mission for THS to really focus on that culture and climate piece. Principal Baran shared that her new vision for the school is to take tangible steps to improve the school so that every student leaves

prepared to choose college, career, military, gap year, or whatever and that every student is at a level where they can choose college, if they want, or they can choose something else, if they want. She also focused on attendance and the school has developed a list of students who have five or more unexcused absences or unexcused tardies in a week, and that list of student names goes out to all staff members. And the staff is charged with making contact with students on the list, and work to connect with these students, not in a punitive way, but just “how are you doing?” They are seeing great success with the list getting significantly shorter week over week. There is a competitive component for the staff, which is encouraging teachers to make connections with students.

Director Miles – Twality MS – Susan Kosmala, every teacher is a language teacher. They discussed quantitative, qualitative and perception data. She learned that Twality is a new AVID school, as of last year. They discussed tier one, two and three supports with AVID and they have SKILL, which is safety, kindness, integrity, learning and love. They have no place for hate group, character strong, emotional regulation and coping skills. They have counselor trained in DBT and Social Workers there. They discussed a 13% reduction in behavior referrals and we talked about what is that about? And what is driving that? She shared that Twality is practicing with student’s “Who Am I”, and how do others perceive me, what is my impact on the community? When they talk about hate speech or they are talking about the history of language, certain language and its impact on others. They are working on chronic absenteeism. They have a parent for Spanish speaking families. The perception piece she said students and staff want and need more love. There are many more opportunities for shoutouts between staff and between students and staff and between students and other students. They also discussed grading practices, because they do see some disparity in D’s and F’s, especially with more of those being assigned to Hispanic students. They are doing a book study on equity based on grading practices.

Chair Irvin – Deer Creek ES with Principal Cori Waufle shared starting with Deer Creek, one of the things that she liked was about the districts focus on Oracy. She said that one thing that Principal Waufle has implemented is reimagining PLCs and sort of what that work is and how to make it meaningful and maybe in a new and different way, and one of the things that they are doing peer, along with the instructional coaches, but also peer led PD sessions. And so these are opportunities for teachers to get to present what they are doing in their classes, with regards to Oracy and then giving their peers ways to implement or integrate that into their own classrooms. Deer Creek is also doing the Ignite tutoring program and seeing wonderful results in that and they have enough seats in that program that they are able to have all the 3rd graders and add some 2nd graders as well. They also discussed the climate and culture piece.

And, Fowler MS with Principal Andy Van Fleet and Associate Principal Cindy Pellicci discussed I-Ready, Literacy and Oracy. Staff is allowed to trade a staff meeting to go into a peer classroom instead, so teachers can get a sub and walk into their colleague’s classroom and see what they are doing in their classrooms. In the 8th grade they have started student success meeting, which is basically taking on-track success program, from the 9th grade and moved it into 8th grade. With this they have opportunities for these core group of teachers to come together and collectively talk about specific student and what is working with specific students. This is about meeting the needs of students. They also discussed climate and culture.

B. Student Acts of Physical Aggression or Violence Policy Update – Presenter: Carol Kinch ~ Time: 7:31 PM (58:53 Timestamp)

Carol Kinch, Director of Student Services, Kelly Shelton, Associate Director of Student Services and Dr. Lisa McCall, Assistant Superintendent, shared information in a PowerPoint presentation, found in the agenda. They discussed:

- SRRH
 - Non-Discrimination Policy
 - Student Responsibilities
 - Student Dress and Grooming
 - Motor Vehicles
 - Threats of Violence
 - Student Discipline
 - Proactive Systems or Support
 - District Administrator Responsibilities
- SRRH Committee

Board members provided the following questions & comments:

- Thank you for your work on this. And ensuring the voices of our educators, community, parents are listened to and taken into account when building this Matrix and Handbook.
- There was a mention that students have a part in the feedback, what grade levels of students are you anticipating involving in this work?
- Want to echo my thanks for this work.
- I just want to have you underscore the point when we see timelines and we say that something, maybe won't be presented to the board until a certain time, sometimes people will read that is or isn't something already in place. I just want you to reiterate that while the Matrix itself as an organizational tool of what we're doing is new, the handbook is already in place with all of those pieces. Most schools have their own handbook, and I think just a reassurance that these tools are already at the disposal of all of our administrators and teachers, we're doing them slightly differently.

C. Presentation of the District’s 2022-23 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report - Presenter: David Moore ~ Time: 7:48 PM (1:16:09 Timestamp)

David Moore, CFO and Tara Kamp, Partner and District Auditor, with Pauly Rogers and Company, reviewed information found in the agenda, regarding the audit report. Ms. Kamp joined the meeting virtually through Zoom and she reviewed the Governing Auditor’s Letter, Federal Single Audit, to ensure compliance with federal monies; the results of the audit. Ms. Kamp shared that the auditors provided an un modified audit with no exceptions or issues. They did not issue a management letter, which means they have no concerns and see not problems. She noted that the relationship with the District is highly professional and gave kudo’s to Director Moore, Sara Mehrabzadeh, Controller and Dr. Rieke-Smith, Superintendent along with all of the business office staff. She said there were no difficulties regarding this audit.

David Moore, CFO and Marcia Chapman, Chair of the FOC, shared that the committee meets two times per year. Chair Chapman provided information regarding the FOC meetings, including the agenda and meeting notes and minutes, found in the agenda. Director Moore shared that there are two Board members who serve on the Financial Oversight Committee (FOC), including, Director Miles and Vice Chair Jaimes, and Mr. Kelleher, Marcia Chapman, Chair of the Committee, and Shannon Moxley and Dr. Rieke-Smith, Superintendent. Chair Chapman shared that FOC reviews:

- Meet with the external Auditor to discuss the district's financial records;

She said that there are no concerns by the committee regarding the District.

- B. Early Literacy Grant – Presenter: Todd Robson ~ Time: 8:05 PM (1:35:05 Timestamp)

Dr. Lisa McCall, Assistant Superintendent, Todd Robson, Director of Teaching and Learning, and Jessica Swindle, Metzger ES Principal shared information regarding the Early Literacy Grant Proposal. They shared that in 2023 the Oregon Legislature established early literacy as a top priority, in creating the Early Literacy Success Initiative. They identified four (4) goals, including: Increase early literacy for children from birth to third grade; Reduce literacy academic disparities for student groups that have historically experienced academic disparities; Increase support to parents and guardians to enable them to be partners in the development of their children's literacy skills and knowledge; and Increase access to early literacy learning through support that is research-aligned, culturally responsive, student-centered and family-centered. - For the Lab portion of this training, are the instructional coaches included in the training?
