<u>Diversity, Equity, and Inclusivity:</u> <u>Grading for Equitable Impact: A Two-Day Event</u> <u>Presented by Becky Peppler</u>

Communicating student achievement in equitable ways requires CALM grades - grades that are consistent, accurate, learning-focused and meaningful. To meet those four conditions, educators and leaders need to ask several questions. 1. To what extent am I confident the students in my school or district receive grades that are consistent, accurate, learning-focused and meaningful? 2. To what extent am I confident that the grades we determine for our students accurately reflect our school/district's publishing learning goals and performance standards? 3. To what extent am I confident that what we do in grading is aligned with and contributes to our school/district's mission, vision, values and goals?

If your answers to these questions are any less than extremely confident, you have inequitable practices happening within your schools and this two-day workshop is needed for you and your colleagues.

Based on Ken O'Connor revised edition of "A Repair Kit for Grading: 15 Fixes for Broken Grades," attendees will be guided through all 15 Fixes for Inequitable Grades and provided with practical examples and solutions to ensure educators are able to move to the highest level of equitable impact when answering these questions. As a result of attending this two day workshop, educators will:

- Understand what it means to have CALM Grading practices that lead to more equitable experiences within their districts, schools and classrooms.


