
The Glen Cove Plan:

Reopening Goals

- Secure the health, safety and wellness of students, staff and all visitors
- Provide for ongoing delivery of quality instruction for all children, at all grade levels

Communication

- Task Force was assembled and stakeholders were involved and engaged during the planning process (i.e. administrators, faculty, staff, parents, BOE, union representation, etc.)
- Information will be provided to students, parents, teachers, staff and visitors including applicable instructions and communicated through signage, training, webpages, school info app messages, robocalls and/or social media. The district will provide families with communication in the language spoken at home.

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

Governor's Criteria for the Reopening of Schools

- Region in Phase 4
- COVID-19 regional infection rate below 5%

*Currently, Long Island meets **both** criteria

June-July: Reopening Plan begins: Administration/Task Force meetings

July 13: NYS Department of Health guidance issued

July 16: NYS Education Department guidance issued

July 31: Reopening plans filed with NYS

July 31: Reopening plans posted on District website

August: 1-7: Governor Cuomo announcement regarding schools reopening

The District's plans are based on the most current guidance from the CDC, NYS Dept. of Health and NYS Education Dept. It is anticipated that these guidelines will continue to change based on evolving circumstances and new information. As these guidelines continue to go through revisions, the District will make the necessary revisions to its opening plans, and inform the community of those revisions.

Caring for the Social/Emotional Health of Students and Staff

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted everyone in our community - for many, the economic hardships and social isolation have been extremely challenging. Recognizing and caring for the emotional/social well-being of our students and staff will be an essential component of the District's reopening plans.

Caring for the Social/Emotional Health of Students and Staff

- Specific staff training in the identification of students in need of additional support
- Increased availability of District counselors, social workers, psychologists
- Collaboration with community-based mental health resources

Screening and Temperature Checks Protocol

First Step: Parent/School/Staff Collaboration

- Parents will need to take extreme caution before allowing their child to come to school. Temperature readings, symptoms checklist must be checked daily to insure minimal chances of infection.
- Temperature checks/screening will be conducted in school as well.
- Working with Dept. of Health for training of staff and enhanced screening protocols

Health & Safety In Classrooms

- Masks/face coverings will be required for all students and staff*
- All classrooms and instructional spaces will be configured to maintain social distancing or barriers
- During mask breaks (and during those times when students are eating lunch), social distancing will be maintained

***If a student needs a mask, the District will provide one**

Social Distancing Protocols for Hallways, Bathrooms and Other Building Locations

Signs will be posted, proper reminders installed and changes in use of building locations [cafeterias, auditorium, library, bathrooms, etc.] to insure social distancing is maintained.

Hand Washing and Hand Sanitizing



- Hand sanitizers are installed in each classroom and throughout areas of each building.
- Touchless faucets have been installed in all bathrooms
- Increased protocols will be in place
- Signage posted to insure consistent use/reminders of protocol

Developing the Instructional Options


Primary Goal:

Enable as many students as possible to return to a full-time, in-school schedule while remaining in compliance with all current CDC, NYS Department of Health and NYS Education Department guidelines.

The Glen Cove Plan

Instructional Options

1. All students return full time in-school
2. Hybrid Model - combination of in-school & remote learning
3. 100% virtual learning for all students



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Special Education

- Services are provided in-person, remote and or through a hybrid model addressing the provision of a free appropriate public education (FAPE) consistent with the need to protect the health and safety of students with disabilities and those providing special education and services.
- As required, meaningful parent engagement will be enhanced by providing information in the parents preferred language or mode of communication regarding the provision of services to his/her child to meet the requirements of IDEA.

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Bilingual Education and World Languages

- Each qualifying school and/or district reopening plan which reopens using in-person or hybrid instruction must complete the ELL identification process within 30 school days of the start of the school year for all students who enrolled during COVID-19 school closures in 2019-20, as well as all students who enroll during summer of 2020 and during the first 20 school days of the 2020-21 school year. After this 20 day flexibility period, identification of ELLs must resume for all students within required 10 school days of initial enrollment as required by Commissioner's Regulations Part 154
- Each school and/or district reopening plan must provide required instructional Units of Study (or, for charter schools, the applicable program outlined in the school's charter) to all ELLs based on their most recently measured English language proficiency level during in-person or hybrid instruction
- Each school and/or district reopening plan must ensure the maintenance of regular communication with parents/guardians of ELLs to ensure that they are engaged in their children's education during the reopening process, and provide all communications for parents/guardians of ELLs in their preferred language and mode of communication



Additional Assurances

- As required, daily student attendance will be collected and reported by teachers and/or an identified staff member while in a remote or hybrid schedule through Google Classroom, Seesaw and/or Google Meet.
- All teachers and principals will be evaluated pursuant to the LEA's currently approved APPR plan, including any variance applications approved by the Department.

Blended Learning

Meeting Patterns:

- Six Day Cycle: Mon, Tues, Wed, Thurs, Fri and Mon
- Students divided in three cohorts: 'A', 'B' and 'C'
- Students divided in two cohorts:
 - 'A' and 'B' (two models)
 - 'Monday & Tuesday' and 'Thursday & Friday'
 - Wednesday is all remote providing time for deep cleaning of building between cohorts
- Students divided in two cohorts: 'A' and 'B' (about 14 people in one classroom)

Summary:

- Two in-person cohorts, one remote.
- Groups A and B will have the same attendance days on recurring weeks
- **Group A, Group B:** in-person learning on two consistent days per week; remote learning for non-in person days.
- Wednesday is all remote, providing time for deep cleaning of building between cohorts.
- **Group D:** remote every day; consists of students who opt out of in-person instruction.
- This represents the most consistency in attendance days, dedicated time for cleaning, but lessened social distancing.

Blended Learning

- Six Day Cycle: Mon, Tues, Wed, Thurs, Fri and Mon'
- Students divided into three cohorts: 'A', 'B' and 'C' (about 7 people in one classroom)

Summary:


- Would match HS and MS, and align days for 19% of families with children across elementary and secondary.
- Three in-person cohorts, one remote.
- In-person two days and remote for four days.
- **Group A, Group B, Group C:** in-person learning 2 consecutive days (twice in a 6-day rotation); remote learning for non-in person days.
- **Group D:** remote every day; consists of students who opt out of in-person instruction.

- Students divided in two cohorts: 'Monday & Tuesday' and 'Thursday and Friday'
 - Wednesday is all virtual providing time for deep cleaning of building between cohorts.

Technology and Connectivity



- Chromebooks will be deployed to all students in grades 6-12 through our 1:1 initiative.
- iPads will be provided to each of our fifth grade students.
- Devices will be provided to all elementary students that do not have their own device.
- Hotspots will be provided to all students that do not have internet access.
- All teachers have been provided with a device (ChromeBook or iPad).

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If and When a Student, Teacher or Staff Tests Positive:

from attendance align with most recent COVID-19

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➡ Next Steps ➡

- Continue to prepare for each plan
- Continue to request information from parents [surveys]
- Continue to receive and process new/additional guidance
- Await Governor's guidance/executive order
- Provide forum for presentation of Glen Cove Instructional Plan that will be implemented, with ability for parents to ask questions [week of August 10th]
- WATCH FOR COVID-19 percentages in the region...DAILY!

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➔ Next Steps ➔

- Training will be provided for students with regard to COVID-19 protocols that must be followed including, but not limited to hand hygiene, proper face covering wearing, social distancing and respiratory hygiene.
- Written protocol will be developed in collaboration with district's director of school health services to instruct staff to observe for signs of illness in students and staff.
- Written protocol for daily temperature screenings of all students and staff with a daily screening questionnaire for faculty and staff and periodic use of the questionnaire for students.
- Written protocol to conduct required school safety drills with modifications ensuring social distancing between persons.
- School/district will designate an administrator as COVID-19 safety coordinator.
