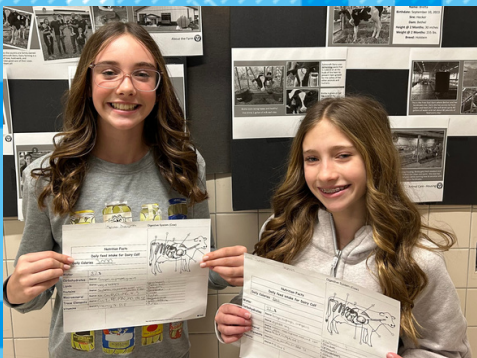

FFA Mid-Winter Convention Farm Show 2024: 2024 Keystone Degree Winners & FFA Jacket Winners



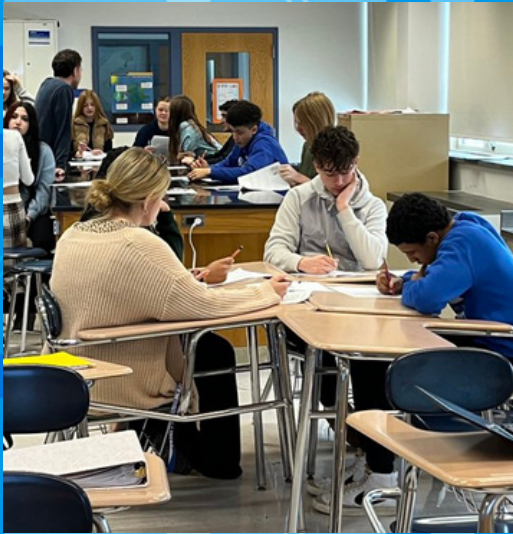

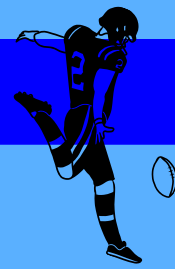
