Planning Ahead...

Intermediate Requirements:

- All students in Intermediate School must be enrolled in at least one Fine Arts course in grades 6,7, or 8.
- All students in Intermediate school are required to complete a minimum of four semesters or two years of Health and Fitness (Health and Fitness, Pre-Athletics, Athletics, or LDC).
- All 8th grade students must take College and Career Readiness – Professional Communications which is a one-semester course that students receive 0.5 High School Credits for taking. 8th-grade

Please remember that students in Intermediate School must be enrolled in at least one Fine Arts course in grades 6,7, or 8 AND are required to complete a minimum of four semesters or two years of Health and Fitness.

Grading in CCISD

Elementary Standards-Based Grading

- Communicates proficiency level on specific state standards
- Multiple topics assessed and reported in each subject area
- Work habits and behaviors listed separately
- Allows learners to set and reach incremental goals

Secondary Traditional Grading

- Assigns grades including daily work and major grades
- Grades are averaged for each grading period and the semester,
- 100-point grading scale with a passing standard of 70%.

Can my student use cell phones/earbuds at school?

Per the Clear Creek ISD Student Handbook:

- Cell phones and one earbud may only be used before the first morning bell, in the Commons during lunch, and after school. Cell phones may only be used in the classroom with teacher permission for instructional purpose.
- The campus principal may impose additional limits on cell phone use.



Will my student be assigned a locker?

Per the Clear Creek ISD Student Handbook:

- Lockers may be provided for the students. Each student is responsible for the neatness and care of the locker assigned to the student. Periodic checks will be made on the lockers to see that each is as neat and clean as possible. Lockers are the property of the school and are provided to the students without charge. The lockers may be searched at any time by school officials. Lockers may not be shared.
- It is important that students keep textbooks, school supplies, and other possessions in their lockers. Do not give combinations to your friends. Locker combinations cannot be changed during the school year. Personal locks are not permitted unless authorized by campus administration.



Does my student have to change out for gym?

- Students do have to change out for Health and Fitness and Pre-Athletics.
- The \$25 class fee that is required covers the cost of the uniform.



Does my student get a laptop?

- Every campus will notify students of a day prior to school starting in which laptops can be deployed.
- Every student will receive a laptop, charger, log-in, and insurance information at that time.



Can I eat or drop off lunch for my student?

Per the Clear Creek ISD Student Handbook:

- A student may bring a lunch from home or purchase a lunch in the cafeteria. Parents may bring food for their child only and must adhere to any campus restrictions regarding the time and method of delivery.
- Please reach out to your child's intermediate campus for specific campus lunch procedures.



Will my student be issued an ID?

Per the Clear Creek ISD Student Handbook:

- During normal school hours, secondary students shall be required to visibly wear identification badges (ID'S).
- Please reach out to your students campus for their specific procedure for distributing and lost ID's.
