

### Year 4—Learning snapshot—what have we been up to this week?

In maths, the class are learning various ways of dividing a 2 digit number by 1 digit. These included partitioning, bus stop method and any other method that the children find helpful - one pupil uses chicken and chips!

In geography, the children have researched many rivers and now are studying mountains. Today in class they have been looking at the Grampian mountains and Ben Nevis in Scotland. The children are looking at a variety of learning points around these mountains; tourism and leisure plus the wildlife and climate there.
