PLAN A: 6TH GRADE TO MIDDLE SCHOOLS


Without altering the current boundaries and locations, relocate the sixth-grade students from elementary schools to their designated middle schools.

- Adds approximately 155 students to each Middle School
- Capacity is approx 600 at BMMS and 884 at GHMS
- Creates space at elementary schools
- Allows for Pre-K growth
- Opportunity to improve culture at the middle schools
- Ability to offer advanced classes and additional opportunities to 6th and 8th grade
- High School space stays the same, and no ability for growth
- Cohorts continue to be split up at GES, CSES and LVES due to Middle School boundaries
- Short term solution to a long term issue


Merge the current middle schools into a single institution while also incorporating sixth-grade students.

- Consider mega campus to be on existing BMMS property or at the current District
 Office property
- Existing GHMS building would be used for High School, CTE classes, Dual Enrollment, and district admin offices
- Middle school population would be around 1,000 students
- Location-neither one is big enough and portables would need to be purchased
- Preschools move to Elementary schools
- School Safety resources would need to increase
- Only one option for families
- Discipline concerns due to the number of students

PLAN C: ADD 6TH GRADE TO MIDDLE SCHOOLS AND RELOCATE GHMS TO DO CAMPUS








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PLAN C: ADD 6TH GRADE TO MIDDLE SCHOOLS AND RELOCATE GHMS TO DO CAMPUS

Provide new opportunities for all students at every site

- Adjust middle school boundaries to coincide with elementary boundaries
- Existing GHMS building would be used for High School, CTE classes, Dual Enrollment, and some admin offices
- Each middle school population would be around 500 students
- Preschools move to elementary schools (starting with 3)
- Allow for growth and additional services at each school
- Improves ability to provide engaging and innovative classes 6-12
- Good stewards of current properties
- Concerns about attracting and retaining staffing
- Moving and new programming expenses
- Logistical issues: traffic flow on Robert, Preschool playground, and licensing
















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PLAN D: RESTRUCTURE ALL ELEMENTARY & MIDDLE SCHOOLS TO PreK-8s

- Facilities not equipped
- Number of classes per grade level
- Lack of opportunities for older students
- Transition to High School more difficult
