Dear Parents/Guardians,

It is hard to believe that we are approaching the 100-day mark of this school year already. As I was at bus dismissal on Friday, I noticed the planter in front of the building is showing signs of the bulbs beginning to break through the surface. This transition is amazing since the week prior the planter was filled to the top with excessive rain that collected, then snow, and finally a solid ice pack following the weekend of wintry weather. To me, the symbolic meaning of the bulbs exemplifies the transitions happening within the building.

We are well under way with grade 5 transition planning. Within the coming weeks, we will share information to the families of next year's incoming grade 5 students. Mrs. Oliver and Mrs. McArthur's Family and Consumer Science (FACS) classes have been working hard this year to learn new cooking skills, nutrition information, sewing skills and information about human growth and development. 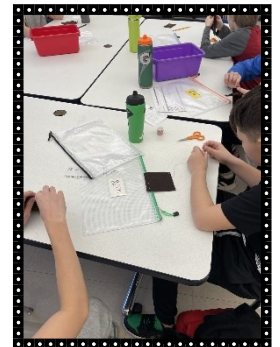
Eighth graders begin the trimester learning about different flavors, then make 3 recipes to explore those flavor profiles. Eighth graders then learn how to machine sew by making a pillowcase. We end the trimester with our human growth and development unit with a focus on relationships.



Seventh graders begin the trimester with a unit on human growth and development. They then work in the kitchen classroom to explore nutrition and kitchen vocabulary and safety. Students will then practice cooking techniques by completing several recipes.



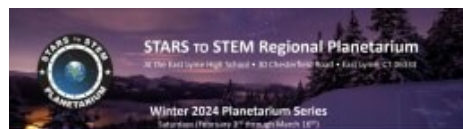
Sixth graders begin the trimester with a child development unit and explore major milestones for kids aged 0-5. Through the hand sewing unit, they learn several different stitches and practice them by making felt monsters inspired by kindergartener drawings from our elementary schools. They will conclude the trimester with a human growth and development unit.



Fifth graders participate in the Challenge unit to learn strategies to handle peer pressure, decision making, internet safety, relationships, self-esteem, and drug prevention. This is a program sponsored by the East Lyme Police Department and is taught by our SRO, Don Hull. Students also complete a human growth and development unit. For the FACS unit, fifth graders get an intro to a nutrition and cooking unit by completing a few recipes based on healthy food guidelines.



Around Town



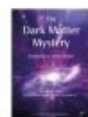
One World, One Sky is a 27-minute full-dome planetarium show that follows Suzanne Sherr's Big Bird and Elmo as they explore the night sky with Hu Hu Zhu, a physicist from Zhongshan, the Chinese co-producer of Sesame Street. Together, they take an imaginary trip from Sesame Street to the moon, where they discover how different it is from Earth. At the end of the show, Big Bird, Elmo, and Hu Hu Zhu join a friendship star to remind them that no matter how far apart they might be, they can always look into the night sky and cherish their shared experiences.

Show times: 11 AM for nondevelopmental children and their families, 2 PM show is for all audiences.



Back to the Moon for Good In case you haven't heard, the Moon is heading again... and in a big way. Narrated by Tim Allen (voice of Buzz Lightyear), this is a complete behind-the-scenes feature on the \$30 million Google Lunar XPRIZE, the largest moonshot prize in history. Adapted from the award-winning digital planetarium show, the 24-minute movie chronicles 18 failures from around the world looking to make history by landing a privately funded robotic spacecraft on the Moon. The global competition is designed to spark imagination and inspire a renewed commitment to space exploration, not by governments or countries – but by the citizens of the world.

Dark Matter Mystery This 36-minute show focuses on exploring a Cosmic Secret: What does keep the universe together? What are the building blocks of the so-called "glue" we have not found yet, that makes the universe look the way it looks today? This planetarium show takes you on a galactic journey to find out. You will see why we know that there must be dark matter all around us and how this search becomes one of the most challenging and exciting searches in particle physics has to offer. Join the scientists on their hunt for dark matter: they'll be in space or deep underground. Will they be able to reveal the dark matter mystery?
