Dual Enrollment - What is it?

- Opportunity to earn college credit while attending high school.
- Take college classes either online or in person (depending on school)

Dual Enrollment

Earn College credit and high school credit for completing courses:

- Must be a junior or senior
- Minimum 3.0 unweighted GPA
- ACT composite score 21
- ACT sub score that meets ACT Readiness Benchmark or college requirements
 - English 18
 - Math - 22
 - Reading- 19
- Must apply to College/University by March 31st.
- Must apply for the Dual Enrollment Grant through TSAC
- Students are responsible for purchasing textbooks and materials needed for class





Dual Enrollment

Partnering Schools

- Cumberland
 - Classes are in person on Cumberland Campus
 - Early College
 - Teaching
 - Business
- MTSU
 - Classes are online
- Volunteer State
 - Classes are online
 - Early College- classes are on campus
 - Nursing
 - Pre-Health



Innovative Early College

Minimum Application Requirements:

- 3.0 unweighted GPA
- 21 ACT for Cumberland, Volunteer State and TCAT Nursing Program
- Completed Algebra 2, Personal Finance, Foreign Language and PE at high school

Must complete application to the college.

Must complete Dual Enrollment Grant through TSAC each school year.

- Refer to Dual Enrollment Grant on eligibility

Costs - approximately \$6000-\$8000 over two years

Earn Associate's Degree while attending High School! Each program approximately 60 hours

 - \$88 - writing
- February 11th -
 - Deadline to register- January 6th
 - Late registration - January 20th - additional \$36
- April 15th -
 - Deadline to register - March 10
 - Late registration - March 24

ACT State Test Date - Juniors

- March 21st -
 - No cost
 - Will register during school hours
 - Will take test during school hours



Dual Enrollment Grant

Must apply through TSAC each school year

Must be a TN resident for one year prior to enrollment

Only use for 1000-2000 level courses (1st and 2nd year)

Covers tuition and fees of student's first five classes, with these restrictions

- In order to receive grant after first semester, students must maintain a 2.0 GPA in all college classes
- Beginning with the sixth grant-eligible course, funding is available at \$100 per credit hour. Student is responsible for remaining balance.

Expectations/Tips for Success

- These are college classes students are treated as college students
- Student will not be able to drop a dual enrollment class.
- Students cannot take math class to count as their 4th math credit. Can take DE as additional class after meeting 4 math credits.

Tips for Success:

- Check your college/DE portal for classes and check daily.
- Check your college email daily.
- Keep in touch with your professor.
- Check your Google classroom (Class of 2025 or 2024) regularly.
- Join Remind for MJHS - codes will be in checklist
