


Hillsboro Intermediate February 2, 2024 Insight






Academics 4th Grade

Students learned how to predict what a story may be about utilizing the text features within a story, and sharpened their skills further by predicting what will happen next in each part of "A Tale of Two Tricksters". Students also read "In the Time of King Adobe" and identified the theme within the story. Students later wrote a paragraph comparing and contrasting the two stories.

Students wrapped up their unit over Republic to Statehood and started learning about life in Texas in the 1800s.





5th Grade

Students have practiced typing their group argumentative essays. Thank you Mrs. Mabry for teaching our students how to type! We have also continued reading our class novel, Esperanza Rising. Students are enjoying the book so far, and look forward each week to listening more! In Social Studies, students have talked about the Civil War and the impacts it had on the United States. In Math, we are extending our knowledge of representations of data as we create and interpret frequency tables, dot plots, stem-andleaf plots, bar graphs and scatter plots

Sixth grade has been working hard to show their knowledge of algebraic relationships between tables, graphs, equations and verbal descriptions. We will be continuing to work on all the skills that we have learned this year as we embark on the journey of Geometry. We are going to be extending our knowledge about triangles to include the sum of the angles and the relationship between the lengths of sides and measures of their angles. Our explorations will also include the area of parallelograms, trapezoids, and triangles, as well as the volume of rectangular prisms.





ESL: Our English learners will be continuing to target areas for improvement in their reading skills by using the I-Ready program. They also will begin working on their summative test in the SummitK-12 program. Each student's results on the summative test will generate a new PLP (Personalized Learning Plan), which will guide him/her towards improvement in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing on the upcoming TELPAS test.
