Since our last meeting there a few things that are happening at our district. We had literacy night last week and the turnout was great. The same night we had a few of our students at Central Penn College and they read a few poems that they have written. We have a few upcoming events we have our play Friday, Saturday, and Sunday it cost \$13 for general admission for adults and \$5

for students. Also we have STEM night coming up at the elementary. Mr. Waters will be attending the Legislative breakfast at the capital intermediate unit one of the issues we will be discussing is the cost of cyber charter school.
