- Live by the RCS definition of family as found in the handbook.
- Support school discipline of your student.
- **Register** any complaints directly with the teacher or administration utilizing the Matthew 18 principle. Do not discuss problems or complaints with other parents.
- **Read** all communications carefully. Be prompt in returning those requiring a response. Attend school events and volunteer as you are able. We need volunteers to help make this school thrive. This promotes the sense that your student is part of a larger community, builds school spirit, and encourages excitement about the opportunities that lie ahead for them as an RCS student.

As a longtime RCS parent, these were a great reminder to me! I reflected on each one and considered whether I am living up to them as an RCS parent, and I would encourage you to do likewise. While no one can live up to these expectations perfectly (not even the middle school principal!), we do expect parents to do their best to support their students and the mission of RCS. In fact, just by reading this Weekly Eagle, you are already one step closer to meeting our parent expectations, so thank you!
