It is hard to imagine, but the 2023-24 school year is halfway through! It is such an honor to watch our students grow each and every day. Reports for the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) for the '22-'23 school year have demonstrated student growth in every category, which is quite an achievement.

Our Office Discipline Referral averages have decreased from 5.44 per day in October to 2.46 per day in December. The number of Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) points earned in January were the second highest for the school year. Our staff at MHE is so very proud of our students!

Some additional highlights from December are that friends and families were blown away by the sweet voices of our students at the Mill Hall Elementary Annual Winter Concert in the beginning of December. We were also blessed to be able to take every student to the Roxy Theater in December to see The Grinch, thanks to our Parent Teacher Organization. Each student was treated to a drink and a popcorn as they were mesmerized by the big screen. Our students were also treated by a special visit by Santa before the winter break as they enjoyed a pajama and movie day as their monthly PBIS Reward.

Despite the need for so many Remote Instructional Days in January, our students continued do great things. Guests from the Wayne Township Recycling Center taught the students and staff about recycling during a school-wide assembly. They were able to shop at our WOWMart school store. While some students used their points to buy toys, some purchased coupons for special opportunities, and others chose to save their points for another time. In celebration of the 2024 Winter Olympics, our January PBIS monthly reward provided our students the opportunity to participate in such events as an Olympic Torch Relay, Ski Jumping, Figure Skating, The Luge, and more. There were many smiles and hopefully the students will be able to make these connections to future Winter Olympics.

Finally on January 31st, our students were able to provide Dr. Martin with a celebratory parade through the halls to commemorate her retirement as the Superintendent of the KCSD.

While we await the early spring as forecasted by Punxsutawney Phil. we look forward to continuing to watch our students at Mill Hall Elementary blossom!

## **Winter Federal Programs Updates**

All elementary schools in the Keystone Central School District are Title I schoolwide schools. That means that all five elementary schools receive Federal Programs Title I money, and we have a series of documentation and meetings that we must provide to families in order to satisfy the requirements of receiving those dollars.

Title I funds follow the students. When our students attend a nonpublic school, our school funds are allocated on a per pupil basis to the nonpublic school to support any students who have an academic need who would have attended a KCSD school. We work with our nonpublic schools to help support our students, because no matter where they attend, students who reside within the boundaries of KCSD are our students.

Title II funds are designed to support the teachers. We use Title II funds for professional development in areas such as mathematics, English/Language Arts, and social-emotional learning.

At all school levels, we use Title IV federal funds to purchase incentives for PBIS (our positive school-wide behavior supports) rewards, and we emphasize the goal of following school rules in all schools.



- Recognize: Is this safe?

- Report: Tell a trusted adult what happened.

## Social Media Safety Tips for Kids

Be Cyber Safe Ask kids what they saw on social media, how they understand what was posted, and how they would respond to various situations they might encounter online.

Limit Social Media Use Limit social media use on platforms that include counts of likes or encourage excessive use. Use screen time settings to help your child set limits and learn self-control.

Stay Connected Link your account to theirs to monitor their use. Explain that posts and messages aren't private and often are permanent, which could affect them now and in the future.

Watch for Problems

If you are concerned your child is dependent on social media, consider limiting access. If you think your child is experiencing psychological harm, talk to a mental health professional.


